Hear the Stories of Our People, of God's People

"...to be the church outside of a church building because within these walls is not where we need faith and build the kingdom; that it's in the streets of Reading, it's in our secular communities, it's in our own houses, and our own jobs and our own schools, where the kingdom is built and that's where the real work is done, and that's where we need faith."

These words were spoken by Zach Warren during a conversation with Pastor Chris on our church's podcast, *Our Story Podcast with Pastor Chris*. Zach is a faithful young adult that is an integral part of our West Lawn Young Adult (WLYA) ministry. During his conversation he opened up about his hopes and dreams not just for WLYA but for our entire church. In the podcast he spoke about the influence that his father had on him regarding his faith formation and his professional career as a pilot. If you missed Zach's story, you can listen to it now on our app and website (found under the media tab on westlawnumc.org). All of the episodes are also available wherever podcasts are found – iTunes, Spotify, Google Play, and TuneIn.

You might be wondering, "what exactly is a podcast?" Well, a podcast is a series of interviews (episodes) that are similar to talk radio. Podcasts do not "air live," but are available "on demand" – you can listen to them anytime at your convenience. Past episodes are not erased as they will always be available for you to listen to again and again. New episodes are released (posted) each Tuesday. Ultimately, the purpose of our church's podcast is to allow people to tell their story. We believe that everyone has a story worth telling because God is at work in all of our lives in many different ways. As we've all come from different backgrounds and have taken different paths to get to where we are today, God has been active and we can benefit from hearing God's leading in each other's stories.

Upcoming Study on the Lord's Prayer



Journey to the Cross: A Good Friday Prayer Vigil

In him was life, and that life was the light of all mankind. The light shines in the darkness, and the darkness has not overcome it." (John 1:1-5 NIV)

PRESCHOOL UPDATE






