
# CrossRoads

In October 1915 "Scientific American" magazine published a piece which told about an employee at the Patent Office in Washington DC who wrote the following in a letter. The year was 1833...

Dear Sir,

Because everything that can be invented has already been invented, it is inevitable that this office should go out of business. Inasmuch as I shall soon lose my position, I hereby resign to look for work elsewhere.

Sincerely,

At that time there was no telephone or telegraph; no automobile or bicycle, or airplane or wireless, and people walked miles and miles to get a sight of a railroad. Today there are millions of patents. Whoever wrote that letter clearly lacked vision.

Vision is more than a buzzword; it has become a necessary tool of every church. Vision is not what we dream about during a Sunday afternoon nap or after eating spicy chili after 10 PM. It is rarely a "burning bush" experience like Moses'. Vision, as modeled in scripture and throughout church history, came as God's people saw the needs around them and then sought God for what God wanted them to do. Moses' leading the people of Israel out of Egypt, David's fighting Goliath, Nehemiah's rebuilding the temple wall, Jesus' calling His disciples, Paul's writing to the church in Corinth—these and other stories in scripture indicate the vision of these leaders. They saw in their mind a future that was preferred more than the present. And their vision propelled them forward to do courageous things. Why does West Lawn UMC need a vision? Here are four reasons...

Vision gets us on God's program and off our own. God already has a plan for our church. God is not confused about where West Lawn should go in the next 5 years. The problem comes when we don't take time to seek him and discover God's plan. Most of us are too busy maintaining our lives and church work. Prayer is often the first to go. Yet it is a vital component in discovering vision. In Jeremiah 33:3, the Lord said, "Call to me and I will answer you and tell you great and unsearchable things you do not know."

Vision helps our dreams become bigger than our memories. Many Churches fail to grow because their memories are bigger than their dreams. Churches tend to hold on to old ways of doing things that are no longer effective. John Stott, an English theologian, states, "Vision begins with a holy discontent with the way things are." It is possible to become so content with our church that we become complacent. We are busy building homes, families, and careers, while trying to live in a chaotic world. Sometimes the last thing we want to see changed is our church. Unfortunately, that sameness can turn to complacency, and if we are not careful, discouragement may set in. But with a vision, the future begins to grow and become clear and larger than the past and present. Discouragement and complacency are replaced with hope.

Vision gives West Lawn a target. Aubrey Malphurs, in his book, <u>Planting Growing Churches for the Twenty-first Century</u> writes, "[Vision] is the ministry compass that helps a congregation and the leaders navigate through the ocean of decision." A church that develops a vision puts a compass in the hands of its people; then we all have a common sense of destiny.

Vision gets people in the game. Every church needs more laypeople actively involved, using their gifts and energies to advance God's kingdom. There are plenty of reasons why members of churches do not get involved. One of those reasons is lack of vision. With a clear and compelling vision that church members help create, a church is better positioned to invite laypeople into the challenges and excitement of being the church. Without it, it's just one more class to teach, light bulb to replace, or meeting to attend.

Scripture tells us that without vision people perish. Every one of us dies a little when we don't have our eyes on the future. But for most of us, there aren't enough hours in the day to focus on the future. The present is in our face, and we need to consciously lift our eyes from the present to the future so our dreams become bigger than our present experience and our memories. The best vision comes out of prayer and dialogue between church leaders and their pastors. Therefore, 2024 will be a time of "Visioning" for West Lawn United Methodist Church, because I firmly believe that God has implanted in the minds and hearts of our committed church family a vision for the future and now is the time to prepare for that future.



Join Pastor Chris on an eight-day "Journeys of Paul in Greece" tour departing from Newark, NJ for \$3,498. Journey to Amphipolis, Philippi, Neapoli (Kavala), Thessaloniki, Veria (Berea), Meteora, Delphi, Corinth, and much more. The rate includes airfare, firstclass hotels, guided tours, entrance and program fees, gratuities, daily breakfast and dinner, overseas transfers, and deluxe motor coach. Family and friends are welcome to join us for the trip.

Curious about the itinerary? Here's day 3: Follow in the footsteps of Paul and Silas to Amphipolis and explore the ruins of the many Christian basilicas there. In Philippi is a baptismal site commemorating where God opened the heart of Lydia (a seller of purple from Thyatira) to hear the words of Paul (Acts 16:13 -15). Lydia and her household were the first Christian converts baptized on European soil. View the Roman-era crypt thought to have served as a prison for the Apostle Paul, and explore Philippi's famous Acropolis, marketplace, the Basilica of Paul, and theater. Today's last stop is Neapolis (Kavala), one of Greece's most picturesque mainland ports, where Paul landed with his disciples, Timothy and Silas. See the Roman aqueduct and acropolis before returning to Thessaloniki for dinner and overnight.

### STEPHANIE SERFASS

 Director of Children & Family Ministries

Youth Pastor



Stephanie Serfass, West Lawn's newest staff team member, is originally from the Valley, PA. Growing up, she had an excellent example of living faith in her parents (mom -Debbie is a UMC pastor's daughter & father - Joel have largely influenced her faith journey). As a child, she and her three siblings (one of whom attends West Lawn - Kimberly Duffy) were raised to prioritize the importance of faith. Steph credits also them with demonstrating an incredible model for generosity and service.

Steph has worked with children in her first home church in Bethlehem, PA, volunteering and then taking on a small part-time paid childcare role as she grew up. Her early career focus was on Occupational Therapy following a fall that resulted in two badly broken wrists that required occupational therapy. Becoming well acquainted during her time receiving rehabilitation and surgeries, she discovered a potential career path in early childhood development and pediatric occupational therapy. Stephanie then worked as a certified occupational therapy assistant in the school system, focusing on special needs and ASD. She remains passionate about working with children and families with special needs or who are neurodivergent.

Life challenges of her own and in the lives of those she loves eventually led her to take time away to reflect and reassess her path. During this time, she began to feel strongly that she needed to be in the church; unsure of the specific capacity, she responded to a churchwide bulletin announcement calling for help needed in children's ministry. She attended church regularly, learned as much as possible about various ministry path options, and attended Bible studies when offered.

During this time, she did whatever was needed to help the Director of Children's ministry. This relationship's proven reliability and work ethic led to another part-time childcare position. She continued volunteering during this time. When the children's minister left to start a family shortly thereafter, a Kids' Ministry restructuring opened up a previously unavailable job at the church. From there, she became the Children's Ministry Coordinator, later being promoted to Director of Kids' Ministry after completing a bachelor's degree in Theology & Biblical Studies.

She is passionate about what she does and ensures each child feels seen, known, accepted, and loved unconditionally. Early conceptions or experiences of the church can aid in a child's core beliefs and, hopefully, an understanding that regardless of what happens in life, they can come 'home' to the church. The relationships with youth at church have been primarily with those whom she has taught earlier during her time in ministry or with those who serve; her previous church did not have an active youth ministry since pre-covid times, but she is very excited to begin working with the youth in West Lawn.

Professional life aside, Steph values physical activity, faith, transparency, creativity (graphic design and her self-proclaimed odd font obsession), family, and sarcastic humor. Steph is leaving the 'sunshine state (where she has lived for roughly ten years) to move back to Pennsylvania and be closer to her siblings, grandmother, aunts, and nieces.



West Lawn's electronic church directory has a member website and mobile device app. **Instant Church Directory** is the program we use for our directory.

To view our directory online, go to members.InstantChurchDirectory.com and follow the prompts under "Sign In" to "Create a login now." Use your email address you have on file at West Lawn. For security reasons, you must confirm your email before you can sign in.

There is also a free mobile app available for download at the Apple® App store, Google Play<sup>TM</sup> store and the Amazon Fire App Store. Simply search for "Instant Church Directory" to get the download.

You will be asked to enter your email address that is on file at West Lawn UMC. If your current email address is not on file with the church, let Kelly Rismiller know so that it can be added. Once you enter your email, follow the directions on-screen to complete the "create a log-in now" process. Because we are using a two-step verification system for security purposes, you will need to check your email before being granted directory access.

After you are signed up, you'll see the most current directory for our church. Any time updates are made, they will show in the directory. If you are using the mobile app, you will be able to search for families and members, and call, email and text right from the app.

Once logged in, you can edit what information is made public to the West Lawn congregation. Currently addresses, phone numbers, email addresses and month/day birthdays are all published.

You can also upload a family or individual photo to your profile. Please consider completing this step so that everyone at West Lawn UMC can put a name to a face!




