

Happy Holidays to all!

For many of us the holiday season is over; it ended as the New Year began. We have celebrated, and I hope enjoyed, Thanksgiving, Christmas, and the New Year's Eve Party.

But for the Christian community the holiday season is far from over. January and even February continue to bring us times to celebrate: January 6th, Epiphany of the Lord, January 8th, Baptism of the Lord, February 19th, Transfiguration Sunday.

Our secular culture ignores these events - so does the church.

Epiphany is the time to take down our Christmas decorations at home and at church. Putting the ornaments, and the tree away for another year.

But this is not what the Bible tells us; Epiphany is the story of Magi coming to worship the child Jesus. The Bible translates the Greek word "magi" as wise men. Were these men kings, court magicians, astrologers, or astronomers? The Bible does not really say.

Were there three of them? Magi is plural, but three "gifts" does not mean three persons.

Where did they come from; when did they come? What about that star?

Given all the things that the Bible does not say about the magi, what does the Bible tell us?

God will go to extraordinary means to draw all to His Son Jesus. We can rejoice in this story for it means that God intends His salvation for all people, not a select few. God used a special light in the sky as a unique invitation to those mysterious magi. Today, He still draws people to Himself. When God's word has its way with us, when there is no rationalizing away its true meaning, then the Holy Spirit uses it to draw us to Jesus. When the Word of God works in us according to its truth and purity, the Holy Spirit will use it to build faith in us and give us three gifts: forgiveness of sins, life, and salvation.





There are perhaps additional questions to consider...


- What does the Bible say about homosexuality?
