

I remember being in maybe first or second grade and Lent would come along. Lent seemed to always be about giving something up, doing without something that you really liked. I thought maybe giving up homework or even school would be a good idea. But that didn't work out very well.

So, I decided, against my will, to give up chocolate. I think it may have been a class thing or something. I can't imagine it was my idea. So, we all gave up chocolate for Lent. I would just like to say that 40 days is a really long time. Although, for some reason, Sundays didn't count. So, each week, I would count off the days until Sunday. Now I would not have considered myself a chocoholic, but I did enjoy a Hershey Bar here and there. In fact, I still do.

Well, then Easter would finally come, and we were all free. All the chocolate we ever wanted. We could eat it, smell it, let it melt all over our hands. It was ours for the taking. The wait was worth it.

When I think back, I can't help but wonder if we may have missed something. Were we waiting for the wrong thing? We probably did not really understand what Lent was all about.

Lent, as we know, is a season of forty days, not counting Sundays, which begins on Ash Wednesday and ends on Holy Saturday. The English word "Lent" comes from the Anglo–Saxon word *lencten*, which means "lengthen" and refers to the lengthening days of "spring." In Lent Sundays are considered "Little Easters" as we look forward to the Resurrection.

Lent is to be a time of repentance where we can choose to do many things, even give up chocolate. But it can also be a time to take a look at ourselves and our lives. It can be a time to reconnect with God. Maybe we have drifted a bit, and we can use this time to recenter ourselves.

Matthew 4:1-11 tells us that Jesus was sent into the wilderness by the Spirit, where he fasted and prayed for 40 days. During his time there he was tempted by Satan and found clarity and strength to resist temptation. Afterwards, he was ready to begin his ministry.

Well, we don't have to fast for 40 days, but I am sure we can find many things to do that will help us redirect our hearts back to God. Maybe there are things we need to let go of. Things that are keeping us from being all that God intended us to be.

How about that neighbor who needs help, or that mission at church that is looking for people to serve? There are lots of opportunities. Maybe it is time to dust off that Bible, and join a Bible Study.

We are a couple of weeks into Lent, and you may already have begun some things, but just in case you haven't, this may be the time to think about all that God gave up for us and start to think about what can we do for Him?

And then on Easter morning, when we celebrate the Resurrection, the risen Christ, that glorious day, we can move forward knowing the greatest sacrifice of all time was for us.

Seven Last Words: A Good Friday Prayer Vigil



Dear West Lawn Family,



Each of us has times when we are lonely, grieving, hurt, or in need of care. In his second letter to the Corinthians, Paul writes that when we suffer and are troubled, we find comfort through Christ (2 Corinthians 1:4-6)—and one of the ways we find this comfort is through other caring Christians.

Our congregation has a group of people skilled in caring for those facing challenges in their lives. These people, called Stephen Ministers, have undergone extensive training to develop and nurture their caring skills. Our Stephen Ministers work within a strict bond of confidentiality. They care for people who are experiencing many different kinds of crises.

Who might receive care from a Stephen Minister? Care receivers may be hospitalized, grieving the death of a loved one, separated or divorcing, homebound, unemployed, adjusting to the birth of a child, or experiencing many other kinds of life difficulties. They may be members of our church, or friends, neighbors, and co-workers without any church home.

Think about your life and the lives of the people around you. Are you, or is someone you know, going through a time of crisis or challenge? The care of a Stephen Minister may be exactly what's needed to help bring Christ's healing.

Consider whether you know of someone who needs their care and offer to connect them to this ministry. And please keep our Stephen Ministry in your prayers.

Dear Food Pantry Volunteers & Supporters,

We had a good volunteer turn out of 30 people in January, and we thank all who helped. We are grateful for our volunteers, especially the interest of the teenagers from the Hope for Humanity club at Wilson HS of which five showed on a weekend.

Please consider volunteering some time for set -up on Thursday, March 14th (12:30 to 2:30), or Friday, March 15th for giving food out to our neighbors in need from 2:30 to 5:00 PM. We can use ANY TIME YOU CAN GIVE!

The Helping Harvest order had more variety this time [28 items instead of 18] and we are getting 144 of each item of food available. People have been wonderful in giving us food and checks to help purchase when items ordered of food are very limited some months. Donations to the pantry are vital to the support that we can give to the families in need. Our dependence on the donations from our supporting churches is even more important than ever as the need grows. On Thursdays during set-up, our volunteers make up over 100 bags of food to give out. This food comes from what we collect from our member churches.

The pantry needs donations of nonperishable food items. The pantry especially needs donations of

- ♦ Canned fruits
- Canned vegetables
- Pasta sauce or tomato sauce
- ♦ Spaghetti
- Canned meats especially canned tuna, spam, or chicken
- Peanut butter
- Canned soup

Bags are made up from food donations from the six churches that support our pantry, so please consider bringing two or three cans on a Sunday morning each week to share with neighbors.

Everyone that volunteers must complete the civil rights training once per year.
