#### "O God, our help in ages past, our hope for years to come, Our shelter from the stormy blast, and our eternal home."

As my time here as West Lawn's "senior pastor" comes to a close, and my retirement looms in the not-to-distant future (next month – not yet!), I find comfort in the fact that this ministry is not about any one individual, but it has always been about God. Our call to ministry is like God, eternal and never-ending.

Long before I was appointed West Lawn's senior pastor (only the 4<sup>th</sup> in our most recent 80 years!), indeed long before I was a twinkle in my mother's eye, this congregation was proclaiming the Good News of Jesus Christ. Before God spoke into my heart – *and the bishop's!* – about serving here, this congregation was teaching stories of God's Love to the children, ministering to the needs of this community, supporting missionaries and mission work locally and globally, and doing the things Jesus would have us do – feeding the hungry, sheltering the homeless, and ministering to those in need.

One hundred and ten years ago someone's vision for a new faith community was birthed into reality in the barn of Riegel's dairy farm, located on what we now call the West Lawn playground. On Ascension Day, May 19, 1912, after much seed-planting and the result of many dreams and prayers, God's people came together for worship. Only God could have known what the next 110 years would hold.

Over the years this congregation was led by retired clergy, student pastors, and received our first "resident pastor" in the midst of a global economic depression. We worshiped in a barn, a white-framed structure on Penn Avenue, and later a brick edifice that is now the northern (flat ceiling) section of our present sanctuary.

When the church saw an uncertain future, God raised up a new, young preacher and sent him to serve this church. When we could not seem to find a way to pay the mortgage, God raised up a group of committed members to free us from the yoke of debt. When we outgrew our building, God provided a larger sanctuary (1957), an education building (1967), a renovated fellowship space and handicap access (1987), and an additional building – the Community Center (2007) – for added ministry space.

Under the leadership of the Rev. Rollin T. Reiner we paid off our debt, expanded our facility and campus, and grew to be a strong church that at one time had 400 total worshipers between our two services AND 400 attending Sunday school each week. Led by the Rev. Stacy Myers, West Lawn saw our worship attendance grow to 600/week, and West Lawn became a "home" and church family to many. During the ministry of the Rev. Dr. Menno Good we expanded to a third worship service and were called to deep reflection as to the kind of church God was calling us to be. And I hope that in these past 22 years God has been at the helm, steering us, guiding us to effective ministry in our community and around the world. I pray that we have been faithful to making disciples of Jesus Christ for the transformation of the world, as we have sought to invite, embrace and empower all to be the family of God in Christ.

I hope you will join us in worship each Sunday this month as we:

- Celebrate our Preschool, recognize our new softball teams, support Native American Ministries, and share in Holy Communion on May 1<sup>st</sup>.
- Honor our mothers and share in the baptismal covenant on May 8<sup>th</sup> Mother's Day.
- Stand in support of our young people as we receive our newest members on Confirmation Sunday, May 15<sup>th</sup>.
- Recall our history and dream of our future on Anniversary Sunday, May 22<sup>nd</sup>.
- Remember those who gave their all so that we could live in freedom today, on Memorial Day Sunday, May 29<sup>th</sup>.

What a blessing it continues to be to serve God with you in this place we call our church home, West Lawn United Methodist. What peace I feel, in knowing that our ministries will continue on long after I retire. What a joy it is to pray for this church and its future, including ministry under the leadership of your next senior pastor, the Rev. Tom Ebersole.

# **Upcoming Study on the Lord's Prayer**



## **UMCOR Collaborates to Relieve Ukrainians' Suffering**



The United Methodist Committee on Relief (UMCOR), is collaborating to send 47,895 pounds of medical supplies and equipment worth \$935,000.00 to three hospitals in Kyiv, Ukraine. The first shipment arrived at the State Ukrainian Health Ministry Heart Institute in Kyiv on April 14. The second shipment was shared between the Heart Institute, the Center for Pediatric Cardiology & Cardiac Surgery Clinic for Children and the National Specialized Children's Hospital, which is the nation's largest children's hospital, on April 20. The third shipment is scheduled to follow soon, according to Roland Fernandes, general secretary of UMCOR who added "We multiply our own efforts and the generosity of our contributors when we engage in creative service partnerships."

Lena Denman, president of the Arlene Campbell Humanitarian Foundation, expressed appreciation of UMCOR for its role in the project. "The Foundation is honored to receive the support of the United Methodist Committee on Relief for efforts to provide medical supplies and medical equipment to the State Ukrainian Health Ministry Heart Institute in Kyiv, Ukraine," she said. "This hospital serves not only Kyiv, but also suburbs of Kyiv that have experienced mass atrocities. It was because of the support of UMCOR and its contributors that we were able to arrange transportation for these three shipments of vital medical supplies." "This is the biggest shipment we have ever had," said Dr. Vitaly Demyanchuk, deputy director of the State Ukrainian Health Ministry Heart Institute in Kyiv. "Every box contains useful supplies that give us the possibility of providing high quality medical care to our patients, for wounded individuals and others in our area. We thank all of the American people. Together we are strong." Items in the shipments include wound care/triage supplies, surgical kits and masks, examination gloves, mask respirators, varieties of hospital gowns, stethoscopes, sterile containers and basic medicine.
