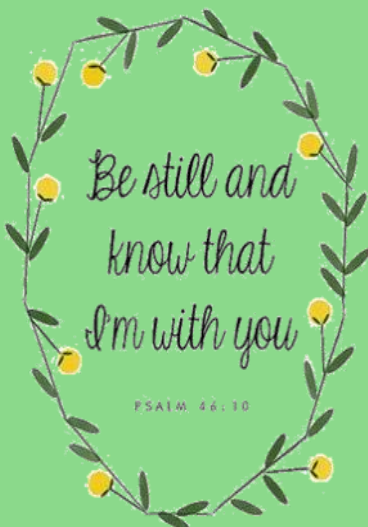

**Attention
Graduates!**



On November 15, 2022, the world's population surpassed 8 billion people. China and India remain the two most populous countries in the world, each with more than 1 billion people. The United States' population is almost 332 million people, making up a mere 4% of the world's population (*source: United Nations*).

All of these people live across God's creation, which now includes 195 countries. Currently, there are more than 6,500 languages spoken, with over 300 used to communicate in the United States. While there are thousands of dialects, the overwhelming majority of the world fluently uses less than two dozen of them. English is spoken in 58 countries, serves as the official language for 39 of those countries and ranks as 4th on the list of fluent speakers. Hindi and Spanish rank second and third respectively, while Mandarin Chinese is the most spoken, as it is used fluently by more than 17% of people in the world (*source: worlddata.info*).

When I think about the world's population, the number of countries, and the plethora of languages spoken across the globe, I can't help but feel as a speck of dust in the grand scheme of things. And yet, God knows each of us by name. God created all of the people in the world and everything that has ever existed within it. God desires for us to be in relationship with Him, with creation, and all of the people within it, united in one family. But with so much diversity and such vastness of the globe, how is that possible? Answer: The Holy Spirit.

Fifty days after the Resurrection (on the Day of Pentecost), God sent the Holy Spirit to the Apostles, and then to 3,000 that day (*Acts 2*). "And everyone present was filled with the Holy Spirit and began speaking in other languages, as the Holy Spirit gave them this ability." People from different regions and locations were amazed that they received the gift of being able to communicate in different languages (not incoherent speaking in tongues). The Holy Spirit gifted them the ability to talk – to communicate – with one another so that they could bond as one in the family of God.

Sunday, May 28th, is Pentecost this year, and it continues to be a celebration of God's gift to us in the form of the Holy Spirit. The Holy Spirit continues to play an integral role in our faith, as it inspires us, encourages us, and guides us to live out God's commandment to love one another. With so much beautiful diversity that God created in the world with His people, He unites us in the love of Christ with his language of love, given to us by the Holy Spirit. While we are many and diverse, we are one in God's family. It is my hope and my prayer that we'll continue in this command of love, using the gift of the Holy Spirit, to welcome all to be a part of God's family here at West Lawn United Methodist Church.

Jack Williams

In 2016, Jack Williams started working for Berks Coalition to End Homelessness (BCEH). At the time, he was retired from his career as a business owner and planned to only work part-time for a few years to help out his friend Sharon Parker, who was the Executive Director at that time. When Sharon passed away unexpectedly, Jack did not hesitate to step into the leadership role to ensure that the important work of BCEH continued. Although he had no prior non-profit experience, Jack's passion for

helping the homeless, business acumen, and the collaborative approach has allowed him to help the organization redefine its mission and role within the network of social service providers in Berks County, helping thousands of homeless individuals along the way. Under his leadership, the agency rose to the challenges presented by the pandemic and its unprecedented impact on the community.

Aside from being the Executive Director of BCEH, Jack had a key role in the establishment of the Exeter Area Food Pantry (EAFP). Jack and his wife, Karen, have resided in Exeter Twp. since 1980. Approximately 12 years ago, Jack and Karen got together with a few concerned neighbors to address food insecurity in the Exeter/Birdsboro area. The Exeter Area Food Pantry was soon launched and began to provide food to over 200 families per month. With the tremendous support of the community and Helping Harvest Food Bank, EAFP continues to feed and support its neighbors in need.

Jack is humbled by the Paul J. Hoh award, but feels the recognition is much more a reflection of the team at Berks Coalition to End Homelessness than anything that he has done personally. He is blessed to work with a very caring group of professionals that daily carry out the mission of fighting against homelessness in all shapes, sizes and populations.

Pennsylvania ranks #8 in the nation as one of the states with the highest homelessness population. Over 13,000 Pennsylvanians are homeless on any given day.—U.S. Interagency Council on Homelessness

Jack and Karen have been members at West Lawn UMC since 2005. Jack has served on the church leadership team, as well as many other ministries here over the years. Philadelphia Phillies Bus Trip

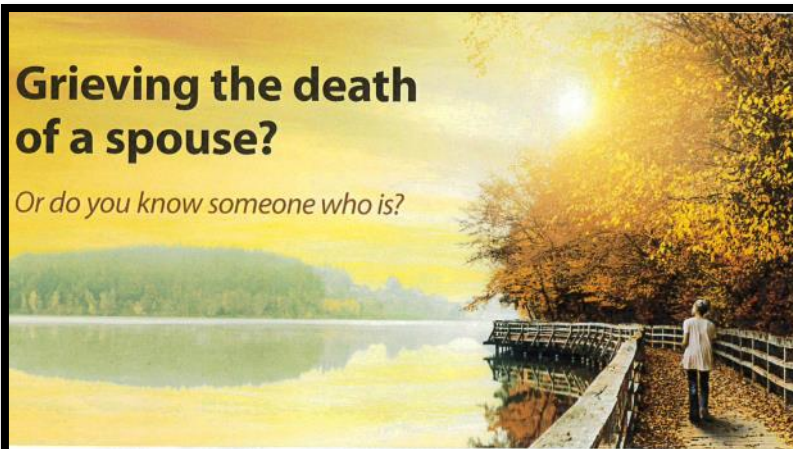

Our next Griefshare group begins Wednesday, June 14th from 6:30-8:30 PM in Room 109 of the Reiner Education Building.

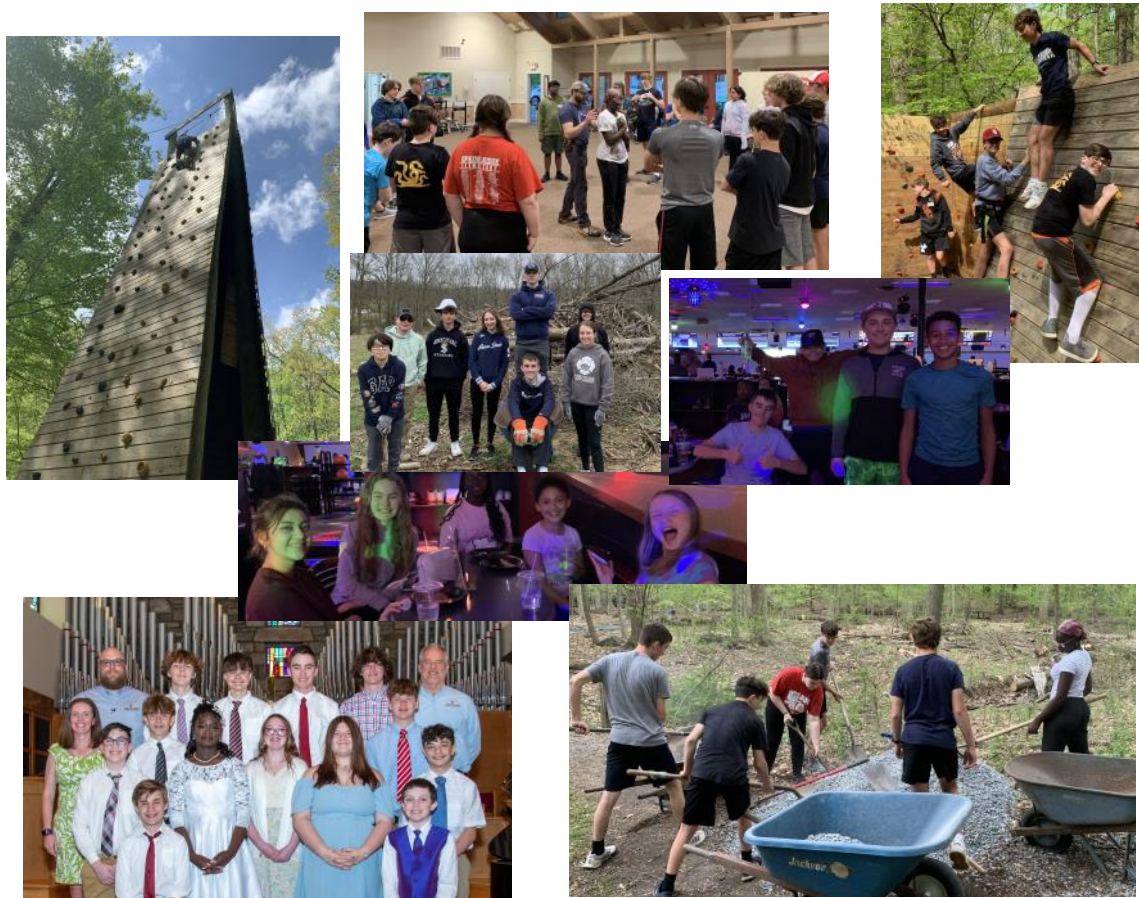
