United Women in Faith will again host our **Thanksgiving Eve Worship Service** at 7:00pm on November 23rd. This year's theme will be:

"Life-Giving Transformation"

Bringing the message this year will be Chaplain Leah Knox, chaplain at Phoebe Berks Village in Wernersville. Members will lead the service as we celebrate all the gifts that we have received from God during this past year. EVERYONE is welcome and encouraged to attend this service.

Putting our "faith into action" is the purpose of our group—supporting each other, the local community, as well as global outreach.

How many hours of television do you watch each day? Think about that for a moment. From the time that you wake up to the time that you go to bed, how frequently do you find yourself watching sports, the news, or binge-watching the trendiest show on Netflix or Hulu? An hour? Three hours? Six hours? According to multiple reports, the average American watches anywhere from three to four hours of television per day. Let that sink in for a minute... three to four hours of TV per day. Some watch more, some watch less. Let's assume that you get eight hours of sleep per night; that means that you are spending approximately 25% of your waking hours watching TV. Extrapolate that over the course of a lifetime, presuming you live to reach the average US life expectancy of 78 years, you would have watched TV for about 15 years of your life. 15 years! Admittedly, during football season, I exceed the daily average of TV watching (unless the Dallas Cowboys are playing poorly, then the TV may turn off a little earlier than usual).

I don't know about you, but when I think of the amount of time spent watching TV, especially considered over my lifetime, it makes me feel a bit of guilt, even slight embarrassment, when I am reminded of that New King James Version word that I like so much, a "sluggard." Am I being a sluggard by watching this much TV? To be clear, these are my feelings, and I'm not projecting my feelings onto you, nor am I judging you.

While I'm thinking about the time spent watching whatever sport is in season, or the newest action movie, or the psychological thriller limited series that everyone is talking about, I can't help but recall the parable of the three servants as told by Jesus (Matthew 25:14-28). The point that Jesus is making to each of us is that we are each entrusted with time, and talents, and treasure. God has gifted us each and we are intended to use it for good, specifically in building up the kingdom of God. While each of us has unique talents and different levels of financial resources, regarding time, each of us have the same amount of time each day. Ultimately, how we choose to spend those 24-hours, day-in and day-out, is a personal decision.

I'm not saying that we don't deserve to disconnect from the world and to be entertained from time to time. What I am suggesting is that we should consider what God will say to us when we go before his throne and we are giving an accounting of our time and where we invested it. That's between each of us and God. When considering our investment of time, will God say, "well done good and faithful servant" (Matt. 25: 21, 23) or will God say "you wicked and lazy servant" (Matt. 25:26)?

Hopefully I haven't made you feel too guilty and you may be wondering what else you could do with your time. How about instead of watching TV, you watch TV instead? You read that correctly. Instead of watching 3-4 hours each day of mind-numbing TV, you invested 20 minutes, or 10 minutes, or even 5 minutes in growing in your faith? Instead of watching a half-dozen episodes of your favorite drama, you watched one less and inserted a compelling, high-quality, theologically sound, devotional video? And the best part is, if you know how to navigate a streaming service like Netflix or YouTube TV or any of the others, you'll know how to operate this one: RightNow Media.

RightNow Media is an online discipleship tool, the "Netflix of biblical video resources," that includes tens of thousands of videos and free discussion guides. Some of our small groups and individuals have been using it for over a year and a half here at West Lawn UMC and I'd encourage you to use this resource if you haven't already. The best part, it's FREE to you. You'll find videos and studies on every conceivable topic in our lives – parenting, marriage, Christian living, work, finances, Christian doctrine, etc. In addition to browsing RightNow Media on your



computer, laptop, or tablet, you can download the RightNow Media app on your iPhone, Android, Amazon FireTV stick, Roku device, or Chromecast, and browse just like you would on Netflix. Get your access today and start investing quality time with God by growing in your faith on RightNow Media. If you have any questions, please contact me.

Frequently people ask "How much should I spend?" What would you do for your own child or grandchild? 

Don't worry about shopping for a car because our church has a limited number of complete derby kit cars that include a precut, unfinished car, that comes with wheels and axles. No cutting or power tools necessary! The only thing that it needs to be race-ready is some slight assembly (attaching the axles with wheels to the body – takes about one minute) and your decorating... you can paint it, color it with markers, add stickers, the choice is yours! The car styles available to purchase for \$10 from Pastor Chris or Kelly Rismiller are a funny car, roadster, bandit coupe, and sling dragster. You are welcome to buy and build your own car elsewhere and bring it to the derby. \$10 for a pinewood derby car is a great deal!

And there's more! A LEGO racecar can be built and sent down the same track as the pinewood derby cars. The only thing is, LEGO racecars need a special chassis to operate on the track; unfortunately, LEGO wheels will not work, sorry. You can purchase the LEGO chassis for \$10 from Pastor Chris or Kelly Rismiller as well.

Pinewood derby kits and LEGO chassis are limited; it is recommended to get them from Chris or Kelly before the day of the event. To secure your kit and/or chassis, register for the event now!

Think you make the best pot of chili? Prove it!

Cooks of all ages and skill levels are invited to participate in our inaugural Chili Contest on Saturday, November 19 from 11:00 am to 1:00 pm in our Community Center to earn the People's Choice Award.

Traditional red chili, homestyle chili, white chicken chili, chili verde, vegetarian chili, black bean chili, your secret recipe chili, whatever your favorite chili may be... it's welcome to be a part of this fun event.

It's true, your chili will be judged. Regardless of the recipe, chili should look appealing and have a pleasing aroma, and it should taste good! Meat should have a distinct chili flavor and be tender; not too mushy or too firm. Consistency matters; sauce should not be too thin or too thick, it should have a nice balance with the meat. Heat from spices should not be bland, nor should it be too hot. Your chili may be made with any combination of meats, including beef, pork, lamb, bison, chicken, or turkey. No wild meats. No pterodactyl. Beans are permitted, including canned beans. Fillers, like rice or pasta, are permitted.

The contest will be judged by anyone that desires to participate from our congregation and community. Each chili taster will make a \$5 donation – paid at the door – that will entitle them to taste each chili once and indicate their top 3 chili recipes by way of paper ballot. Chili tasting and judging will begin at 11:00 am and end at 12:00 pm. Once the judging segment is complete, each chili taster will be invited to receive a bowl of their desired chili, while portions last. Any excess chili will be donated to New Journey Community Outreach.

Sour cream, shredded cheddar cheese, and saltines will be provided by our Kitchen Ministry. Our wonderful team will also prepare sides and snacks that will pair perfectly with chili. Additionally, kid-friendly food, including hot dogs and tater tots, will be available.

IMPORTANT: Contestants shall prepare a minimum of 6 quarts of chili brought to the contest hot, ready-to-eat, in a crock pot. If more chili is prepared to refill the crock pot, it should be in a clearly marked, enclosed container. Cost per entry is \$25. Pre-registration is required, made on our church's website/app. For the purpose of health and safety, each entry will complete a general ingredients list, that will be made available to all of the chili tasters.

Based on anonymous taste-testing, in addition to bragging rights, the top three contestants will be recognized. The top bowl of chili will earn the coveted People's Choice Award. No cash prizes or equivalent will be awarded. Proceeds benefit the mission and ministry of West Lawn UMC through our Men's Ministry.

And it's not just a chili contest day, it's also Pinewood Derby and LEGO derby day in our Community Center!





Update from the Property Committee

We are pleased to report to the Membership items of interest from the Property committee:

- 1. The 100 Woodside property has been completely renovated and is waiting final certification approvals by the Township for meeting public use conditions, such as fire protection, safety, and communications. The use will be primarily meeting space which is provided by three separate large rooms, and also there are two small office rooms. A full kitchen and bath are also available. Please feel free to make arrangements to see the property. It is normally locked when not in use.
- 2. For a couple of years now, we have been strategizing and negotiating with the Township of Spring for "full ownership" of the Alley that passes between the Education Building and the Church. Currently the Alley(s) are 50% owned by the properties that border it and 50% by the Township. Our objective was to obtain full ownership, then redirect the Alley through our parking lot to Noble Street so the neighbors could still have access to "their" Alley. If we succeeded, we would then have the right, now or in the future, to build a two-story addition between our two buildings providing primarily a larger Narthex and other rooms for Church use. We presented this concept to the Township Board of Supervisors at a public meeting in November of 2020. Shortly after, we received a letter saying that the Board of Supervisors approved the request. We were then told later that in order to exercise the approval they would have to send notice to all of our neighbors bordering the Alley and then hold an open session to hear if there were any credible objections. We hired an attorney to help mediate and guide us through this process with the Township. This entire process was very slow in implementing. We finally received an open session Board Meeting date and the neighbors were given the required notification. The Board asked us to restate and confirm our request, to agree to make changes they requested if approved, and we did so. The Board then asked if there were any objections and four Alley residents, our neighbors, were present and spoke for 1.5 hours offering a wide range of objections. The Board members did not accept rebuttal from the Church and the Board voted unanimously to NOT APPROVE our request. This subject is off the table for now.


