Jesus answered, "I am the way and the truth and the life. No one comes to the Father except through me.

-John 14:6

Whoever does not love does not know God, because God is love. -1 John 4:8

Dear West Lawn Church Family,

I have to admit, in today's world I find it difficult to discover the truth, the real truth; truth that is not shaded and draped with someone else's perspectives. So much of the truth is expressed as the one and only way. At the same time one person's loving act is labeled by another as disgrace, a misinterpretation of love.

In scripture, God asks us to look at Jesus and to see the one who is Truth. The image of Truth itself. In addition, the Bible tells us that Jesus is Love. The one who is Truth is also the one who is Love -- it is not possible to separate them without diluting or limiting both of them. And God is grieved if we try to separate the truth and love we find in Jesus in any way because they are part of the same, inseparable. Any time we try to dissect one from the other, we sin. Expressing truth apart from love, or love apart from truth, is a fallen attempt; God demands the whole. Truth and Love are united in Jesus.

To proclaim Truth that moves away from Love is to proclaim no Truth at all. To declare we are loving while moving away from Truth, we simply fool ourselves into thinking we are loving. And to do either is to move away from the one who is both Truth and Love. Eric Metaxas explains this in his book *Letter to the American Church* claiming we often speak so much truth with so little love that we are actually not speaking truth, we offend others. We are more concerned with justifying ourselves as uncompromising providers of the truth than with actually providing the truth.

The inverse is an equivalent problem, to show so much love that we misinterpret the love that is Jesus and neglect God's truth. We can become so fearful of saying something controversial or disagreeable for the reason that we might push someone away, avoiding the very truth God wants someone to receive. The Apostle Paul calls us to "become all things to all peoples" so others may know Christ. But we have to be careful as we are obligated in our call to Truth and Love.

Only Jesus fulfilled this calling in its fullness; however, we are all blessed as ambassadors for Christ in this hopelessly confused and broken culture. What are the circumstances and issues that you face in this time and place that require the Love and Truth known only in Jesus? Call upon the Holy Spirit in seeking to fully represent both as the best Christ has to offer.

Any toppings (shredded cheese, sour cream, saltines, etc.) shall be brought by the contestant.

Chili tasting and judging will begin at 11:00 AM and end at 12:30 PM. Winner announced by 1:00 PM.

Beginning at 12:30 PM, pints of the remaining chili will be offered for a donation to those in attendance. All donations will be applied to the ASP Mission Trip in 2024.





Thank you for giving your time and talents for our West Lawn Church food Outreach programs. Welcome to the new servants, and thank you for the continued support from the "steady eddies."

The purpose of this mission is to help individuals and communities with their food insecurity as much as we can. This includes meals, groceries, donations, bag lunches, etc. These items can come from anywhere, for example, products from stores, food service businesses that may have leftovers, day old bread, products with short shelf life, our own West Lawn Wednesday meals, free turkey or ham certificates from supermarkets, etc. Keep this in mind when you go anywhere. Restaurants like Panera have been a great source— it doesn't hurt to ask! We would rather have the product be put to good use rather than disposed of.

Ruth Stephens, and Dan and Sue Allan have spearheaded this group for years. They transport food supplies to two places downtown: New Journey located on Pearl St. off of Franklin Ave. and City Light (The Keep) on North Ninth St. The trips are done primarily on Tuesday and Thursday mornings, because this is the time we are given baked goods from Giant. They also transport food items that might be left over from West Lawn Wednesday and other church functions. This might mean a trip down town on other days. They use their own cars to transport these items.

As such, we are trying to organize a more regular way to reach the servants for the gathering and delivery of food and groceries to the various locations throughout Berks county.
