
Time to Share Christmas Messages with Inmates Again

Imagine what it would be like to be behind bars this Christmas, with limited contact with family and friends. Receiving a card with an encouraging note that shares the message of God's love from someone "outside" would be such a meaningful gift!

The Eastern PA Conference Prison Ministry and Restorative Justice Team (PMRJ) will launch this year's Christmas Cards for Inmates Ministry effort hoping to build on its pandemic-forced, scaled-down effort last year. Last year, the team provided over 4,000 signed cards to correctional facilities for their inmates and staff, crediting that success to supportive congregations and determined team members who picked up and dropped off bagged cards at cooperating churches. The team will use the same system this year, relying on six participating churches.

WLUMC will again participate in this program which we hope to begin in October. Simply pick up your packet of 5 cards and follow the included instructions. Please make sure you return your cards in the box at the Welcome Center in the narthex, or return them to the church office by the deadline on the instruction card. We will need 900 cards to cover the Berks County Prison, and West Lawn members have come through every year!!

INVITE, EMBRACE, EMPOWER



"In essentials unity, in nonessentials liberty, in all things charity." -John Wesley

taught John Wesley Christianity was essentially about love for God and neighbor, growing through the means of grace, and staying connected "agree even when we disagree." religious His offspring, Methodism, squarely traditional Christian practice; we believe in the virgin

birth, the resurrection, the humanity and divinity of Christ, the Trinity and other things addressed in orthodoxy. As Methodists we hold the Bible in high authority under the lordship of Jesus Christ. Scripture was inspired by the Holy Spirit, written by human hands, and codified by holy councils. God is in all of it. Wesley did not teach scriptural inerrancy and infallibility – he taught the importance of interpreting it faithfully through tradition, reason, and experience. Our Articles of Religion state the Bible contains everything necessary for salvation.

We faithful Methodists like to say we read the Bible through the lens of Christ, who fulfills the law and (as our Associate Pastor argues) makes the Pharisees mad. To make sense out of the scriptures we read it through the person of Christ who loved every broken person he came across. The only people Jesus scorned were the Pharisees who had lost sight of love because of religious rules based on their stiff interpretation of scripture. The Bible claims God is love, and everyone who loves is born of God and knows God (1 John 4:7). Therefore we believe it and seek to live it by following Jesus.

Our denomination, the people of The United Methodist Church, agree on all these essential core beliefs. But we are likely the most evenly widespread denomination in the United States – we have a longstanding tradition of diversity of thought which bears varied opinions on many cultural issues. These issues have troubled our longing for unity, primarily, the issue of human sexuality but there are others. The divisive nature of the issue has affected our conferences, our churches, and our clergy.

Some of you have asked how the issue affects me. Here is what I want you to know. I made a promise at ordination to be faithful to The United Methodist Church and uphold its discipline. I have done so, and I plan to continue. I follow The Book of Discipline of The United Methodist Church which insists that all people may participate fully in the ministries, sacraments, and programs of the church. I would not officiate a same gender wedding, but I am steadfast about inclusiveness. It is the way of Jesus, and it is included in the vows I took. There is no plan in the denomination that compels pastors to perform duties they are not comfortable performing, telling churches they have to do something inappropriate for their context, or constrains conferences from setting standards for ministry. I respect that some will leave The United Methodist Church because of their convictions, but I will remain because of mine.

Like me, the members of our church have also taken vows to be loyal to The United Methodist Church and support it. We are the body of Christ. I don't have all the answers, but our divided culture needs a witness to love that transcends our differences, not giving in to the polarization of our times. The United Methodist Church is not perfect, but it is home, and we find purpose here that transforms our broken world.



Why Stephen Ministry??

A question for which I don't know if I have an answer. In 2002, I retired from my job. I was a member at West Lawn and serving on a few committees, but not overly involved and suddenly had too much time on my hands. I kept looking at things available at church and praying, but didn't feel nudged to any of them. Then in 2003, Pastor Sherry started talking about a program called Stephen Ministry. When I talked with her about what we would need to do, I got stopped at "praying out loud" because I absolutely did not do that. She said that the problem was I was praying for the people around me to hear and not to God! I was afraid of what people would think of my prayers and I would need to pray with a care receiver?? She encouraged me to become a Stephen Minister and my fear of praying would change. I did, and it did.


Galatians 5: 22, Fruit of the Spirit, is a very large part of my life and being able to serve God and learn from others has been part of who I am. Then in 2004 I also moved into Prison Ministry and prayed out loud all the time! Why am I always amazed at what God can do when I know He is amazing?

In late 2006, my mom had a stroke. My parents lived with me and after three months, I brought mom home. I had the sweetest mom God ever gave to a child, but with her round-the-clock care, after a few years I had to move away from Stephen Ministry. I couldn't seem to take care of mom, my dad, myself and someone else too. The Stephen Minister needed a Stephen Minister. Momma died in 2015, but I didn't want to start caring for someone else again. I was worn out!

I hesitantly said "yes" to Pastor Lisa when she called a couple months ago to try and pull me out of retirement and back to Stephen Ministry. God nudged, I went, and I am so glad I did. I believe serving God and serving others is where God wants me. The Fruit of the Spirit rings throughout the Stephen Ministry program at West Lawn, through its leaders, through its servants, and through the people we serve. When God nudges you, just feel the fear and do it anyway, and I guess that is the answer as to why I am a Stephen Minister.




