Dear Parents,

I am grateful for the chance to walk with your child on this significant step in their faith journey. Confirmation is an important opportunity for students to make a personal affirmation of their faith. They are saying yes to membership at West Lawn UMC, yes to membership in the United Methodist Church and most importantly they are saying yes to a lifetime of faith with Jesus. Confirmation is one of the main reasons I began working with students at WLUMC!

There is a lot to be covered and accomplished between now and Confirmation Sunday. I am hopeful that this packet will help answer some questions, provide some details and serve as a guide for the remainder of the confirmation process. Our goal is to give as much information about upcoming events as possible, but as we all have learned, planning is subject to change in this always changing world. We are also hopeful that students and families will take seriously the events planned, and do their best to attend classes & weekend events.

Specifically, there are three retreats throughout the year (one Fall, Winter, & Spring). These retreats allow students to bond with one another, make their faith more experiential and provides extended time for meaningful conversations about their faith. We want your child to have the best opportunity to grow in their faith and these retreats play a large part in that process. See the schedule attached for specifics.

Students will also have a mentor to meet with them, answer questions and provide a safe space to wrestle through the topics being covered in class. We are hopeful that these meetings will be fruitful times for the confirmands to engage with what they are learning and to solidify what they believe.

The third piece of Confirmation is the Involvement Menu. The square style page in this packet allows youth to interact with various parts of our church and for their faith to be a physical part of who they are. Students need to choose various items in each of the three areas- Worship, Fellowship, and Service- but there are choices so every unique person can find where they may fit best here in the body of Christ found at West Lawn UMC.

Last but not least are Sunday morning classes. In an effort to create the best program, and to balance the other 3 weekends away, we have cut in half the time spent in Sunday morning classes. Having done that, we would like to run class from 9am-10:30am. This allows enough time to dig into topics like Spiritual Gifts, Serving at the Local Church, Salvation, Grace, and so many more. Plus, it will give parents time to fellowship with others between 9-9:30am.

Finally, I want to strongly encourage active participation in both the youth ministry and the larger church family. At the end of this process students become full members of the church family. Our hope is that they actively participate and serve in the life of the church both now and moving forward.

I am looking forward to everything the Lord has in store in the coming year and feel blessed to have the opportunity to work with your youth this year. 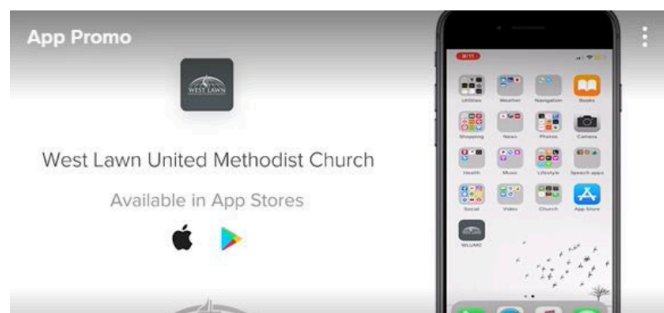
Gretna Glen Confirmation Retreat- This weekend is organized Conference wide, and includes Confirmation students from UM churches across the Eastern PA Conference. This has been one of the most important weekends for students to think through their faith along with many others students from various churches. We head to Gretna Glen for outdoor fun, new friends, and again, delicious food.

Mentor meetings will happen 8 times throughout the year, and occur about once a month. They should be scheduled between just the two parties involved at a mutually agreed upon time. We always demand our same Safe Sanctuary rules to be followed (meeting a semi public place, or if conversations happen over text, the parent should also be included in the text). The church building is always available, or some prefer to meet at a public place: restaurant, library, park, or outdoor space at someone's house, etc. Just contact Trisha if you wish to reserve a room at church for a mentor meeting.

Student/Parent Confirmation Covenant

This covenant helps to provide a clear picture of what expectations there are on a student during the Confirmation year. Of course we are willing to extend grace, but wherever possible, we would expect families/students to abide by the following guidelines:

1. Attendance at 80% of class sessions- Attendance assumes participation and completion of all in-class assignments. While we realize that students have busy lives, it is important to have a full understanding of what it means to become a member of the church, and to begin to grow in their faith with others their age. This comes out to missing about 2 classes throughout the school year.
2. Attendance at Sunday morning worship- If you are preparing to become a member of the church, you should expect to regularly attend worship services.
3. Meet regularly (approx. once a month) with an adult mentor- All confirmation participants will meet with his or her mentor for 8 sessions, using the materials provided to the mentor.
4. Attendance at the three scheduled retreats is expected- The Fall Retreat allows students to begin to form friendships and thus jump into faith conversations more easily because of the dedicated longer day format. The Winter Retreat, open to all in 6-12th gr, will be a weekend where they can develop their faith in a deeper way while enjoying the opportunities that Pocono Plateau has to offer. The Spring Retreat is for Confirmation students only, and is open to all UMC Confirmation programs across the Eastern PA region. It is more of a culmination of the process, alongside other youth taking the same Confirmation Vows.
5. Participation in other church programs and functions: The Church Involvement Menu helps to guide students on ways to be worship, serve, and be apart of the Body of Christ here at West Lawn UMC with the hopes that they will continue to engage their faith through these various ways here at West Lawn UMC.
6. Attendance at Confirmation Rehearsal and making time to sit down and have a short private discussion with either Pastor Tom or Pastor Chris before making the decision on Confirmation.

West Lawn UMC Firehouse Youth Behavior Contract

As an attendee of all Youth functions, both on the campus of West Lawn UMC & off campus events, I (Student/Adult Name) _____ know certain behavior standards are expected of all attendees, in order to create a safe and enjoyable experience for all. I understand that with my presence at any WLUMC Youth function, I am agreeing to the terms below:

-I have the right to have fun. Thus, I also have the responsibility to help create an environment of fun by participating to the best of my ability & encouraging others to do the same.

-I have the right to be safe and free from harm. Thus I also have the responsibility to contribute to this safety (physically, emotionally, mentally, etc.) in a positive way with my words & actions.

-Including but not limited to; no illegal substances, weapons, cursing, inappropriate physical contact, and no insulting others in any way, shape or form.

-I have the right to be respected. Thus, I also have the responsibility to respect other people, students & adults, as well as all property, and rules for various activities.

-Including but not limited to; Respecting physical property; no destruction of church property, no misuse or purposeful wasting of supplies, no inappropriate use of tools, supplies, technology, video, or game equipment. And respecting others; working out disagreements without slander, rude comments, or other degrading communication. We just respect each other as humans who deserve to be treated with decency, fairness, and understanding.

-I have the right to express my faith openly. Thus, I also have the responsibility to respect other people's faith when it doesn't always align with my beliefs. We are each unique, and we agree to accept others opinions, even when different than our own. For it is in these challenges we increase our love, grow deeper & strengthen our own faith.

Mistakes happen, and we all need redirection at times. If a minor incident, or breaking of the contract has occurred, the following steps will be taken:

1. The person will receive a verbal explanation of how the rule has been broken. This may be done privately or publicly depending on the current circumstances.
2. A Parent/Guardian will be notified verbally or via email of the circumstances.
3. After the first warning, the person will be allowed to stay and continue during the event.
4. If a second warning occurs, and the student has expressed no interest in following the rules laid out above, he/she will be removed from the group, and the Parent/Guardian must come pick up the child immediately.
5. A plan for the student to return to Youth Group Events will be created using various restorative practices in a timely manner. Both the Youth Pastors and the Youth/Family will agree upon the Return Plan before it is set in place.

If a major incident occurs (using illegal substances, weapons, bullying, etc.), the following steps will be taken:

1. The person will receive a verbal explanation of how the rule has been broken. This may be done privately or publicly depending on the current circumstances.
2. A Parent/Guardian will be notified via phone and the student will be removed from the group, and the Parent/Guardian must come pick up the child immediately.
3. A plan for the student to return to Youth Group Events will be created in a timely manner, using various restorative practices. Both the Youth Pastors and the Youth & family will agree upon the Return Plan before it is set in place.
