Sermon Text Genesis 3: 13

August 24th

"Then the Lord God said to the woman, 'What is this that you have done?' The woman said, 'The serpent deceived me, and I ate.'"

Brief context:

Genesis 3 is the account of the Fall into sin. In verse 13, God confronts Eve after Adam blames her. This moment is heavy with consequence and grace.

Why Does God Ask Questions He Already Knows the Answer To?

Q: If God knows everything, why does He ask Eve, "What is this that you have done?"

What Does Eve's Answer Reveal About the Nature of Sin?

Q: What does Eve's response, "The serpent deceived me, and I ate," tell us about human nature after the Fall?

How Does God's Question Still Speak to Us Today?

Q: How does God's question, "What is this that you have done?" apply to our own lives?

Q: Is there any hint of the Gospel in Genesis 3:13?

Final Reflection:

- God's question invites us into truth, not shame.
- We are not left in guilt we are led to grace.
- Jesus took our answer "What have You done?" and bore our sin on the cross.

Suggested verses for encouragement:

- Romans 5:12–19 (In Adam, death; in Christ, life)
- John 8:10–11 ("Neither do I condemn you...")
- Psalm 32:5 (I acknowledged my sin...)
