











Something To Think About



"GROWN UP CHILDREN'S STORIES"

I can still remember the Noah's Ark sheets and mobiles that decorated the kid's rooms when they were babies. Noah and a bunch of animals, all smiling as they sail in a boat under a rainbow painted on a blue sky. It was so cute, right?

Of course, the story of Noah and his ark doesn't come across as "cute" when you read it in the Bible. In Genesis, we read a story of world-wide depravity, apocalypse, and a family struggling with what it means to be the last and first people on earth. I imagine that Noah and his family, were they with us today, would find it odd to see their likenesses on baby sheets and nursery wall hangings.

There are stories in the Bible that we sometimes selectively edit or leave out altogether when we are talking with our children. Stories like Noah's ark or the binding of Isaac are hard enough sometimes to make sense of as adults. Other stories, such as Jesus healing a blind man, are far more impactful than the miracles that they detail but are too often treated like a simple recounting of Jesus' daily schedule. In seminary I took a class where I didn't know until the first day of class that our entire semester would be spent talking about 1 chapter of the Bible, Genesis 22. I walked out of that first class thinking this was going to be the most boring class I had ever taken. It ended up being one of the best. I came out of that class with an appreciation for how deep the treasure of Scripture is and how much we leave unexplored.

Starting January 7 at 6:15 PM, I will be leading a new Bible study called "Bible Stories for Grown-Ups". In this study, we will look at 4 stories in the Bible that are perhaps more challenging stories than we often assume. We will spend 2 weeks with each story so that we can not just hear the stories as the Bible shares them with us but also give full consideration to how these stories speak into our modern world and modern lives. Some of these stories will be stories you know (or think you know). Some of these stories may not be as familiar to you. All of them are stories that deserve the attention of grown-up

eyes and minds.

Below is the schedule for this study, which includes a video component. I invite you to take time to read the stories ahead of time from your Bible and come with thoughts and questions.

- January 7 & 14: Noah and the ark Genesis 6-9
- January 28 & February 4: The binding of Isaac Genesis 22:1-19
- February 11 & 25: The parable of the talents Matthew 25:1-30, Luke 19:11-27
- March 4 & 11: Jesus Heals a Blind Man Mark 8:22-9:24

HYMN OF THE MONTH: BLESSED BE THE LORD GOD ALMIGHTY

Sometimes the seeds planted, grow in spurts. That was the experience of Bob Fitts. He moved his wife Kathy and their two young children to Kona, the big island of Hawaii, in the early 1980s in hopes of helping young people through the evangelism program called Youth With a Mission (YWAM). Despite the beauty of their surroundings, Bob and his family found pervasive poverty. He and his family were only able to find a place to live in a "coffee shack", a ramshackle construction on the edge of a coffee bean farm.

He was asked by a church to sing something special that gave God glory despite the dismal living conditions. He fashioned the song in his mind, but didn't even write it down. On his first presentation of the song, his memory failed, and was unable to complete it. He left the service in great dismay and a sense of failure. On the way home, however, the melody and words returned. He recorded it in his own shack-home, and sent the tune and words across the world to the many locations of YWAM across the globe. Its lyrics "We lift Your Name in all the earth" soon became quite true indeed even to 40+ years later.

Bob and Kathy call Singapore their home base church now, but still own a place in the Kailua-Kona area. Bob recalls one of his most humbling and astounding moments was listening to thousands in a stadium in South Korea singing "Blessed be the Lord God Almighty" in a language he couldn't even speak.

I have chosen this song of praise as our hymn of the month because it helps us also start the year off knowing that even as a new year has come, our Almighty God "who was, and is, and is to come" has plans for us and for His kingdom to grow in us and through us.

Amen. So let it be.

ALL ARE INVITED TO CELEBRATE DOTTIE'S 80TH BIRTHDAY!


