









Something To Think About



"WHAT'S REALLY IN YOUR WALLET?"

Several years ago, I was having a lot of lower back pain, and so I went to see a massage therapist to get some relief. She was asking me questions about the type and frequency of the pain, and then she asked what I thought was a most unusual question: "Where do you keep your wallet?" She obviously saw the look that came across my face, so she went on to say, "Men tend to put their wallets in their back pockets. If you spend a lot of time driving in the car or sitting at a desk with your wallet in your back pocket, your back is placed into an unnatural and awkward position that can cause muscle strain and aches."

Usually if my wallet is a problem, it has more to do with what is or is not in it. I never knew where I kept it could be a problem too! Fixing that problem was easy. Fixing the other problems doesn't always seem so simple.

A well-known credit card commercial ends by asking the question, "What's in your wallet?" They ask the question trying to convince us that if our wallet doesn't have their credit card in it, we have a problem. But if we peel away the marketing spin, I wonder if the question that is being asked is not worthy of our consideration. What really is in our wallets?

I remember one Christmas when my aunt gave my uncle a new wallet. He immediately opened up the wallet, as if looking for something that should be there. And, in fact, my aunt had put a \$100 bill in the wallet. I immediately asked him what he was going to buy with the \$100. He said, "Oh, I won't spend it unless I have to. I always keep a \$100 bill in my wallet in case of an emergency. \$100 can get me a couple of meals or a hotel room (this was a while back, needless to say) if I am stuck

somewhere." That moment has always stayed in my memory. For me, I saw that \$100 as buying power. For my uncle, he saw that \$100 as security.

In his book Money and Possessions, noted Biblical scholar Walter Brueggemann observes that Scripture talks about money and possessions in several different ways. At times, it might seem that Scripture is arguing against itself. How can money be a gift and an idol? Starting August 31, as part of our "Feet Going, Hands Doing, Hearts Being" emphasis, I will be preaching a 6-week sermon series that asks these and other questions to help us consider the role that money and possessions plays in our lives and the vision God has for our money and possessions. I believe that what we will discover is that what is really in our wallet is far more than pieces of paper, plastic, or metal. It is power that can be used for good or evil. It is opportunity and it is obstacle. It is an invitation to a path and to a relationship.

Come on August 31 and help us ask and answer the question, "What is really in your wallet?"

CHILDREN'S PROGRAMS RESUMING


Our children's programs are resuming after a summer break.

HYMN OF THE MONTH

Christian Contemporary songs are most known for their use of Hebraic names for God and a focus on adoration in worship. Worship is certainly also enacted by "Feet Going" and "Hands Doing". There are fewer songs about missions in Contemporary Christian songs, but "Touching Heaven, Changing Earth" is one of my favorites! It comes to us from the Hillson group, first popular in the late 1990s. Touching Heaven, Changing Earth was written by Reuben Morgan and released by Hillsong Worship in 1998 and recorded live in Sydney, Australia with vocalist Darlene Zschech.

While Reuben was studying at the Institute of Music, he was involved in a serious car crash. He wrote the song during his extended recovery, reflecting on the fragile and uncertain nature of life. I love that the lyrics highlight the importance of seeking spiritual revival and fostering unity to bring positive change to self, the local church, and the world. I also love that the song has "we" focus instead of just "I" and God. It allows the entire congregation of all ages to affirm that WE seek the Lord TOGETHER. We in prayer will "touch heaven" while "walking our talk" and becoming active with our talents and presence here to change the earth for the sake of the Kingdom.

"We will seek Your face Almighty God— Turn and pray for You to heal our land. Father, let revival start in us-- Then every heart will know Your kingdom come."

Verse 2:


"Never looking back we'll run the race— Giving You our lives We'll gain the prize. We will take the harvest given to us--Though we sow in tears We'll reap in joy."


