

FINANCIAL COMMITTEE FINANCE REPORT

Finances Remain Stable

Hope's income and expenses continue to be doing well against budget through July, with income higher than expenses by \$4661.

Communion Tabletop Donations

Thank you to those who donated funds for replacing the glass table tops for Hope's communion tables. A total of \$1045 was donated, which well exceeds the cost of new and improved table tops. Any excess after purchase will be reserved for other Worship, Music and Arts needs.

Student Parking Rental Program

As of August 6, about 30 applications for student parking permits have been sent to Rosie Buchalski, who is handling this project. Hope receives \$125 for each permit. Look for the new student parking sign in the parking lot and for the number of parking spaces for students with permits.

RELATING BEYOND HOPE

This day-long workshop is for staff, leaders, and members of congregations committed to building congregational vitality; dismantling structural racism and eradicating systemic poverty. It's led by trained volunteers and staff who work with the Presbytery of Chicago's CARE Commission. Some of content covered in this workshop includes:

- Introducing a framework for understanding systemic racism
- Emphasizing the biblical and theological foundation for anti-racism and equity work
- Learning how racism is institutional, not just the acts of individuals
- Unpacking how both people of color and whites are socialized in white dominant culture
- Exploring examples of systemic racism
- Inviting participants to reflect on their context and their institutions; including awareness of how racism effects the church as a whole
- Visioning the long-term strategic work of dismantling the practices that uphold systemic racism in our institutions
