#### From the Pastor's Desk . . .

Now the birth of Jesus Christ took place in this way. When His mother Mary had been betrothed to Joseph, before they came together, she was found to be with child from the Holy Spirit. And her husband Joseph, being a just man and unwilling to put her to shame, resolved to divorce her quietly. But as he considered these things, behold, an angel of the Lord appeared to him in a dream, saying, "Joseph, son of David, do not fear to take Mary as your wife, for that which is conceived in her is from the Holy Spirit. She will bear a Son, and you shall call His name Jesus, for He will save His people from their sins." ## **CLERK OF SESSION**



#### Clerk's Corner Newsletter Article for December 2025



Greetings from your Session!

Your session gathered on November 18 for a stated session meeting moderated by Rev. Ron Beauchamp. Below are some of the highlights of the meeting:

- Session welcomed a guest member, John Dalby, to "Speaking with Session" who presented a summary of
  the Systemic Racism Conference held at Hope Church last August. The moderator of that event, Craig
  Howard the Executive Presbyter of our Presbytery, suggested that Hope Church and Bethel New Life
  Church meet together to decide where we want to take our relationship. John suggested we hold a
  discussion, open to all members of both Churches, after Hope's worship on a Sunday. Session then voted
  unanimously to hold this discussion on December 7 from 11:15am to 12:15pm. More information on this
  to follow.
- Elder Glenn Stith gave a report of the current financial situation at Hope and the status of the 2026 pledge
  drive. Since there are some outstanding pledges yet to be received, we will wait until next month to make
  adjustments to the 2026 budget accordingly.
- The Nominating Committee, under the leadership of elder Sheri Clubb, presented their slate of elder candidates for 2026 to Session which was approved unanimously. Elder Tom Schmidt is nominated to extend his current term by two more years; Anna Lloyd and Sandra Jordan are both nominated for three-year terms. The candidates for joining the Nominating Committee for next year are: John Dalby, Merikay Huszagh and Roberta Peterlinz. The election for the slate of 2026 elders and Nominating Committee members will take place at a congregational meeting immediately after Sunday worship on December 14.
- Session unanimously approved the extension of Pastor Ron's covenant contract as Hope's full-time pastor for a thirteen-month term from January 1, 2026, through January 31, 2027. At the conclusion of this period, Ron will have completed three full years as our pastor and will be vested in the Presbytery's pension plan.
- Session reviewed the results of the worship survey taken on October 19 by members of both Hope and Bethel New Life. Session thanks our administrator, Jaquetta Carter, for typing up all the hand-written entries. The Worship, Music & Arts Committee will utilize the results of this survey to craft future worship services. It was stated that, "We are listening to what the congregations want."

As always, you are invited to share any thoughts or concerns you have with either an individual elder or with the entire session. If you would like to present an idea to the session at our meeting as John Dalby did in November, please contact Pastor Ron or me to be scheduled during the "Speaking with Session" portion of the meeting. The next stated meeting will be on Tuesday, December 16 at 7:00 pm.

## FINANCIAL COMMITTEE

#### **FINANCIAL STATUS**

Through November, Hope's operating income for the year has exceeded expenses by about \$4500, which is a significant improvement since last month, when we ended at about \$3800 in the red. Pledge receipts through November total about \$167,000 against our annual pledge of \$175,216. However, loose offerings are only \$4400 against a budget target of \$15,000, but this shortfall is somewhat offset by the almost \$6000 we have received in student parking fees. Expenses are running about \$5000 under budget so far, so this also helps. If we can meet our pledge goal and have a surge in loose offerings during December, we have a good opportunity to finish 2025 in the black.

#### STEWARDSHIP DRIVE

So far Hope has received 27 pledges for 2026 for a total of \$162,000, with several families yet to indicate their commitments. This compares to 32 pledges in 2026 for \$175, 216. Our treasurer, Debbie Wolski, is reaching out to families who haven't responded this year to try to wrap up a final number for our 2026 budget. If remaining families can at least match their 2025 pledges, we will end up with at least a modest increase in overall pledges.
