

FINANCE REPORT

STUDENT PARKING INCOME

At the end of August, thirty-six Wheaton Warrenville High School students had registered for parking at Hope's lot for this school year. At a rate of \$125 per parking space, this generated an additional \$4500 of income for Hope. This will help balance our operating budget for 2025, while providing a needed service to our high school community. Thanks to Rosie Buchalski for spearheading this parking initiative and to Tom Schmidt for preparing the parking spaces.

HOPE'S CAPITAL RESERVE FUND

So far this year, Hope's income is outpacing expenses, which is gratifying since our 2025 budget projected a deficit of \$8200. However, our longer-term financial challenge is to provide for capital improvements, such as a parking lot upgrade, roof repairs, and HVAC replacements. Presently, Hope has \$12,500 that has been donated to Building and Grounds for such purposes, but this is only a drop in the bucket compared to the anticipated needs. Both the Finance Committee and Session want to highlight this need during our budgeting process this fall. Hope's Finance Committee will place this \$12,500, along with any surplus from this year's operating expenses, and any designated gifts for capital needs, in a Capital Reserve Fund and will report on the status of this fund regularly.
