Christian Education sponsored two major events for the month of June. That's a big undertaking.

First of all, we sponsored PART 2 OF **JENNIE STONER'S DEMENTIA PRESENTATION**. That June 11th program was attended by about 35 people. Those in attendance included people from Hope and Bethel New life as well as people from the community who are looking for help and words of wisdom as they become caregivers of Dementia patients. Jennie gave an excellent follow up to her PART 1 which she gave in 2024. Many in attendance offered words of praise for Jennie's insight into this disease and expressed their hope for PART 3.

Secondly, we sponsored a clinic teaching CPR and lessons in handling an AED machine. We were in hopes of earning an AED machine if we could have at least 20 people attend this class. We did it! Thanks to all of you from Hope, Bethel New Life and the friends and relatives you brought, 40 people attended on June 21. That's great!! Not only did we reach our goal to earn that defibrillator, but we now know how to operate it and also what to do in case of an emergency requiring CPR.

Thanks to the **DUPAGE HEALTH COALITION** for this training and the machine which we earned through their **EVERY DAY HEROS** program.

GETTING TO KNOW CAROL GATS

Interviewing Carol for our July newsletter couldn't have been more informative, with so many details offered about family teaching experience, saying yes to Jim! and the incredible love and friendships found within her own multicultural family community. Carol and Jim will travel anywhere they are invited to join in special events, certainly, to experience the life and joy found with their family. But, let me start with some basics!

Born in Danville, Illinois, Carol grew up on a dairy farm with two sisters (both also became teachers) and a brother (who became a Judge); her mom served as a teacher while her dad

operated the farm. Her ideas about the world were easily formed from tv shows watched, and Carol was eager to explore many of them, away from familiar farm life. She practiced and played the violin in school orchestras, returning to it even today. Carol's family attended a merged church of evangelicals and Methodists and, later on, she and Jim were married in Farmers Chapel Church where her own parents had met in a Youth group!

Living off campus with a sister and her husband, Carol attended and graduated from the University of Illinois, Champagne Urbana, where she, too, served as a student teacher, receiving a degree in history; her first job was in middle school (the grade level she preferred throughout her career) and she loved it. Now this is awesome: receiving a phone call from a friend one night inviting her to McDonald's and, while filling out a raffle form for a Santa Claus as she stepped up to order, a friend of Jim's (also a college junior) looked over Carol's shoulder and memorized her name, giving it to Jim, who eventually knocked on her apartment door, having reported to his own friend that he intended to marry Carol one day...a lesson in never underestimating the power of McDonald's...especially if cupid is there purchasing a burger. Carol and Jim are approaching their 55th wedding anniversary in August!

Upon receiving an MBA, Jim was offered a job with International Harvester operating out of Chicago's southside Oak Forest neighborhood. Carol and Jim "interviewed" and ultimately attended a Methodist church in Oak Forest from '73 through '82, having three children during this time (Jim, Chris, Allison). A transfer was offered to Jim as he moved through the company, and Carol and Jim moved to Indianapolis, where their fourth child (Kenny) was born. Carol loved, still loves, Indianapolis and the multicultural communities of people, art, and music that the city boasts; though not as active in the Indianapolis Methodist church they found, a routine of discovering and attending church continued.

Moving to Wheaton in '86, the family decided to attend Hope Presbyterian church because, as Carol will explain, "the kids wanted to be with the Dalby kids", fast friends eventually as the two families lived, and still live, across the street from one another in Arrowhead, just behind the trees of our parking lot. Carol has served on Session multiple times, was recently a continually active member of the Transition Team, currently serving as chair of the Christian Education committee and, even as she and Jim now disappear to Arizona for the winter, feel close to the friends and family found at Hope. Several years ago, an interim pastor at Hope talked openly about Hope becoming a "Matthew 25 church" with a dynamic mission to carry scripture into action; Carol's interest, especially as she serves the congregation as CE Committee Chair, and as an active Session Elder, is to organize events and workshops that speak to Jesus' prophecy and, frankly, direction i.e. facilitating our members by offering medical and overall health support; ramping up regular games of Bingo resulting in expanded fellowship with one another; designing a women's retreat to provide a potential launch into a regular meeting of Hope's women similar to our successful Relics luncheon featuring men; and keeping her eye on what members need while also remaining aware of what our surrounding communities deserve. She loves Hope and its congregation...people who are interesting, curious, fun loving, and are "friends like family."

In closing, Carol quilts (she is a seamstress), has begun to play the violin again, loves all kinds of music and readily dances whether people are around or not! Her children, whose spouses represent Japanese, American, Persian, and Vietnamese cultures, are Jim and Amy, Chris and Nasim, Allison and Nick, and Kenny and Michelle. Nine grandchildren complete the family tree, with each family member adding their own personalities, ideas, experiences and opinions to family chats. Clearly, Carol is happiest when she and Jim are with the entire family!

This should bring in some unplanned income for the church. Rosie Buchalski has graciously agreed to be in charge of this student parking program.

People's Resource Center Food Pantry

In October 2024 the People's Resource Center opened the door to its new building which also included its new and improved food pantry. On April, group of 13 Hopers toured the new facility, new food pantry, and the new clothes closet.



The food pantry was a sight to behold! No longer were cans, boxes, breads, and produce scrunched into every nook and cranny. No longer were aisles only as wide as shopping carts. The new food pantry is like shopping in a small grocery store. Multilevel makes for easy shopping. A produce island allows shoppers to encircle it to choose the fruits and vegetables they would like.



The new "warehouse" is twice the size of the food pantry with a freezer 2 to 3 times bigger than the one from the "old" food pantry. There is storage farther than the eye can see for dry goods, canned goods, paper goods and diapers! It is a true blessing! Bill Mouka is sure one happy manager for the Wheaton PRC Food Pantry.





Little Red Truck Ministry

Thank you to all of you who donated personal care items and diapers to the PRC Food Pantry on **Saturday**, **June 7**. Bill Mouka and his crew were so glad to receive them. We filled 3 shopping carts overflowing! On **Saturday**, **July 12**, the little red truck will once again be in Hope's parking lot. Communion Tabletops

Each of our 3 Communion tables and 2 small tops have a glass tabletop. Over the years these glass tabletops have become chipped and cracked which poses a safety hazard. Plus, they are heavy to lift on and off of the Communion tables. The Worship, The Music and Arts Committee researched replacing them with shatterproof polycarbonate which would be lighter and more durable than glass.

Carlson Glass in Wheaton quoted us a reasonable price. The cost for each Communion table is \$163.00 for a total of \$489.00 plus tax. The cost for each small table is \$65.00 for a total of \$130.00 plus tax. The grand total is \$619.00 plus tax. Unfortunately, this is not in the WMA Committee 2025 budget.

We thought we would ask the congregation if you would like to make a donation to help us purchase these tabletops. A \$5, \$10, or \$20 donation would be helpful. If you would like to make a donation to purchase one of the tabletops, that would be appreciated too.
