#### Have yourself a Holy little Christmas

The "Christmas season" seems to begin earlier every year. Some stores had Christmas stuff on the shelves weeks before Halloween. What madness! We go dashing through the stores to the beat of *Jingle Bells*; and we go "Rockin' Around the Christmas Tree" until we crash from exhaustion.

Revelry and gift-giving are fine and fun, but if we're not careful they can snowball out of control. Stewarding a Holy and meaningful Christmas means balancing the commercial with the spiritual. Here are some tips:

**Observe Advent:** The four weeks *before* Christmas Day comprise the Advent Season, a time to *prepare* for Christmas through prayer, song, worship, and spiritual disciplines. Lean into the spirit of Advent. Advent devotionals can help (I recommend Richard Rohr's *Preparing for Christmas*).

**Observe the Christmas** *season*: The church calendar lists the *season* of Christmas from Dec. 24 to the feast of Epiphany on Jan. 6. Until the 20<sup>th</sup> century, these 12 Days of Christmas were the time for celebration and partying. Make them special in your life and family.

**Cut the consumerism:** Limit your shopping and spending by setting a strict budget or gifting the people in your life with homemade presents, favors, or ways to spend time together.

**Party hardly:** For some, Christmas is an excuse to overeat and drink to excess. Moderate your consumption.


Most importantly, pray: Ask God to help you and your family craft a meaningful and joyful Advent and Christmas. Ask God to send you wisdom, resources, and people who can journey through the spiritual season with you.

By carefully stewarding your faith life, Advent and Christmas can be a time for real spiritual growth.

As food insecurity continues, variety is important in choosing the items that people can find in the Little Pantry. We are asking you to focus on cereal and other breakfast items, complete pancake mixes (made with water), syrup, peanut butter, jelly, soup, tuna & other canned meats, fruit (canned or in individual packs), lunchbox foods and baby food. Please remember, when you bring your donations to the church, you can put your items directly into the Little Pantry or leave them in the grocery cart in our entryway.

You can also support the Little Pantry with a cash donation that's clearly marked, "Little Pantry."



**NOTE:** We recently learned that we need to have special permits from the State and Health Department if we want to put any type of fresh food

(fruit, veggies, eggs, potatoes, etc.) into the pantry. Your generous gifts of canned and boxed items continue to change the lives of individuals and families in our community. Thank you!

Please remember that our Little Pantry may provide the only food a family has to meet its needs — protein is very important.

Please continue to support this ministry, knowing that your generosity will help families right here in the Plum & Murrysville area.

#### **COUNCIL HIGHTLIGHTS**

October 16, 2025

- At at the end of September, there was a General Fund deficit of \$1,321.97; the deficit was covered by gas lease royalties. The deficit for the year is now \$17,600.
- There are three participants in Confirmation classes and they are very engaged, and the children enrolled in Sunday School are consistently coming each week.
- There were 32 ministerial visits during the month of September.
- The Congregational Life Team reported that there will be a goodwill offering taken at the Christmas concert, which will be split between the Plum Food Pantry and the Kiski Valley Food Bank.
- The Support Team reported that CLC's app is now available for downloading in the Google Play Store.
- Barth Tamenne stated that hard work needs to be done around recruiting new Council members. Kim Boyer and Barth Tamenne finish their three-year Council terms at the end of this year. All other Council members, except Carl Lingelbach, will finish their terms at the end of next year.
- A proposed process for updating our database/membership role was presented for discussion.
- The next Council Meeting will be held on December 18<sup>th</sup>, 2025.




#### MAKE NOISE FOR MISSION WEEKEND!!!
