From the Pastor

We will celebrate our country's national day of Thanksgiving this month. We are blessed by God with daily bread. I have been humbled each time I have been invited to speak words of hope beside a grave or the chance to teach little children, confirm teenagers or lead an adult Bible study. There are so many people, far too many to name individually, who quietly made things happen behind the curtains and who helped to keep our ministry running smoothly in the places where it is most visible.

Thank you for your partnership in the Gospel! I continue to be sure that the God who has been doing

We're so grateful to all who continue to donate to our Little Pantry! The food in the pantry is going fast... We've needed to replenish the pantry at least 5 times this past week, in addition to the generous donations from the folks in our local community who have added their items directly into

the Pantry. As we enter the Fall months, we're hoping to add more variety to the items that people can find in the Little Pantry and are asking you to focus on cereal and other breakfast items, complete pancake mixes (made with water), syrup, peanut butter, jelly, soup, tuna & other canned meats, fruit (canned or in individual packs), lunchbox foods and baby food. Please remember that, when you bring your donations to the church, you can put your items directly into the Little Pantry or leave them in the grocery cart in our Entryway.

You can also support the Little Pantry with a cash donation that's clearly marked, "Little Pantry."

NOTE: We recently learned that we need to have special permits from the State and Health Department if we want to put any type of fresh food (fruit, veggies, eggs, potatoes, etc.) into the pantry. Your

generous gifts of canned and boxed items continue to change the lives of individuals and families in our community. Thank you!




Our thanks to those who funded the renovation and the volunteer who did the work on our Little Pantry.


A Legacy of Faith: The Power of Legacy Giving at Christ's Lutheran Church

Participating in legacy stewardship and the giving of special gifts is a sign of your faith and grateful-

ness for God's grace in your life. Designed to extend the mission of our church beyond the operating budget, these gifts will shape our future by providing long-term financial resources to continue God's work in our community.

What Is Legacy Giving?

Legacy giving refers to the process of arranging charitable gifts to Christ's Lutheran as part of your long-term financial or estate





- Cash, Check, Money Order.
- **Bequests** in a will or trust, specifying a gift to the Church after your lifetime.
- Charitable gift annuities that provide income for you or a Loved one while benefiting Christ's Lutheran.
- Charitable remainder trusts that allow you to receive income while leaving a gift to the Church when the trust ends.
- Gifts of appreciated assets such as real estate, stocks, bonds or mutual funds
- Remainder Interests in Property as created by beneficiary or life estate deeds
- Designating Christ's Lutheran as a beneficiary on life insurance policies or retirement accounts
- Other Beneficiary Designations, such as:
 - ♦ Bank or credit union accounts (POD)
 - Distribution agreements
 - ♦ Donor Advised Funds

Donor Restricted Giving

You are welcome to offer gifts with special directions or towards items that the church may need. **Donor restricted gifts** will be considered on a per-case basis. Congregation Council, in consultation with the Legacy Committee and the Pastor, will determine whether these gifts will be accepted.

The **Endowment Fund** serves to support missions, outreach programs and capital improvements that are not normally included in the annual operating budget. Ryan can assist you with establishing a



NexTrek Recycling Challenge 2025

A big **congratulations** and **THANK YOU** for recycling your plastic bags! We have reached our 1000 pound goal three months early and we've already received our new bench – it's currently located in the foyer outside of the upstairs social hall. It is **fantastic** that we are doing our part to be good stewards by keeping plastic out of the landfills.

To continue this effort, we will now begin to collect plastic bags for our sister congregation, Trinity Lutheran on the Northside. We will have a year to recycle another 1000 lbs of plastic so that they can receive their own bench.

As a reminder, here is a chart of acceptable **clean and dry** plastic bags (no plastic containers): All plastic must be *clean*, *dry*, *and free of food residue*.



JOIN US TO "RISE AGAINST HUNGER"

Rise Against Hunger is a global movement to end hunger by empowering communities, nourishing lives, and responding to emergencies. The Rise Against Hunger event is scheduled for Saturday, November 15, 2025, at St. John's Lutheran Church in North Versailles from 9:30 am to 12:30 pm.

St. John's has reached out to other Lutheran churches to help with this event. They need volunteers the day of the event, as well as funding (it costs around \$4,000 total for this event, and that generates around 10,000 meals). It's an amazing and very moving experience! Anyone from age 5 – 105 can participate. There are jobs designed for every level of energy and

physical capabilities. It's also a really fun time!

This would be a great opportunity for students to receive Community volunteer credits.

COUNCIL HIGHTLIGHTS

September 18, 2025

- The treasurers reported that the general fund deficit for the year is \$16,000. The large deficit at this time of year is attributed to decreased giving, several annual software renewal fees that were recorded in August.
- Pastor Wayne reported that he completed updated communion and confirmation materials and published an ebook highlighting Luther's Small Catechism. He is working on other web-based learning materials.
- Council is in the beginning stages of review/updates to CLC's Constitution and the 2018 Child Protection Policy.
- Council has begun work on the 2026 budget, with Team Leaders considering the outreach, administrative, property, children & youth and congregational life needs for next year.


After our meeting, we all go to brunch at a local restaurant. We invite you to join us for either one or both of the events that morning. For any
