Study/Discussion of Colossians 1:24-2:7

- 1. Paul's Ministry Colossians 1:24-29
 - a. Paul's Attitude in ministry
 - i. Joy
 - ii. Filling up what is lacking
 - 1. A lot of different interpretations
 - 2. He doesn't mean Christ's atonement was lacking because the entire book is about Christ's absolute sufficiency.
 - 3. All agree that there is a close identification between Christ and the Church through suffering.
 - a. His sufferings benefitted the church.
 - b. His sufferings brought about a special union/communion with Christ
 - c. His sufferings were bringing nearer the day the goal of all nations reached and the return of Christ
 - **Passion** iii.
 - 1. He uses words like toil, struggling with all his energy
 - 2. The word can be translated as "agonize" over you
 - b. Paul's Calling in ministry
 - To make the word of God fully known (to preach God's word)
 - 1. Knowing Christ means knowing God's word
 - 2. Looking at the old testament through the lens of Christ

- 3. Mystery hidden for the ages is now revealed to everyone
- ii. To preach specifically to the gentiles.
 - 1. Christ in you, the hope of glory
 - 2. Christ dwells in Jews and Gentiles
 - 3. Eph. 3:4-6 When you read this, you can perceive my insight into the mystery of Christ, 5 which was not made known to the sons of men in other generations as it has now been revealed to his holy apostles and prophets by the Spirit. 6 This mystery is that the Gentiles are fellow heirs, members of the same body, and partakers of the promise in Christ Jesus through the gospel.

c. Paul's Goal in ministry

- i. To present everyone mature in Christ
- ii. Not just a profession of faith
- iii. Transformational faith
- iv. "Paul's means of bringing believers to maturity, according to verse 28, was threefold: proclamation, admonishment, and teaching." R. Kent Hughes

d. Paul's energy in ministry

- labor used in the greek for work which left someone so weary it was as
 if the person had taken a beating. It denotes labor to exhaustion. It's our
 English word agony and is used for agonizing in an athletic event or a
 fight.
- ii. His energy. Jesus' energy. Did anyone look at cross-references here?
 - 1. Philippians 4:13 explains how: "I can do all things through him who strengthens me." the "Him" refers to "the Lord," meaning Christ, from verse 10, which is why some translations make it plain: "through Christ who strengthens me."
 - 2. 1 Timothy 1:12 confirms that Paul indeed has Christ Jesus our Lord specifically in mind as the supplier of his strength: "I thank him who has given me strength, Christ Jesus our Lord." Similarly,
 - Ephesians 6:10 confirms this connection of human strength provided supernaturally by Christ himself, the God-man — the particular person of the Godhead who Christians confess as "Lord": "be strong in the Lord and in the strength of his might." Finally
 - 4. 2 Timothy 2:1 makes the same connection between spiritual strength and Jesus as the source: "be strengthened by the grace that is in Christ Jesus."
 - 5. "Paul not only claims to be strengthened by divine power infinitely precious as that is. Paul speaks with more specificity. He testifies to divine-human power, to having Jesus's own energy "all his energy" worked in him, and done so "powerfully," by Christ himself." David Mathis

- 6. Jesus knows what it's like to have human limitations. He hasn't left us to our own frailty.
- 7. We need to ask for His energy.
- e. Not just Paul or pastors, but all of us.
 - . African woman who got saved. She was blind, uneducated, and 70 years old.
 - 1. Had missionary underline john 3:16 in french bible
 - 2. Sat outside the door of a boys school
 - 3. Asked if they knew french
 - 4. Asked them to read and translate the sentence underlined in red
 - 5. Asked, "Do you know what this means?"
 - 6. Shared the gospel
 - 7. Over the years 24 young men became pastors due to her work
 - ii. She had what Paul had
 - 1. A heart for ministry
 - 2. A calling to minister
 - 3. A goal for ministering
 - 4. And the energy to minister

2. Paul's Concern for the Colossians Colossians 2:1-5

- a. The intensity of his concern
 - i. That word means agonizing over them
- b. The actual concern
 - i. Increased knowledge and focus on Christ
 - ii. This is in contrast to whatever that false teaching is that is circulating
 - iii. What we believe about Christ, our conception of him, is everything.
 - 1. List what we know just from Colossians
 - a. Image of the invisible God
 - b. Lord of creation, ruling, and sustaining
 - c. Lord of redemption, ruling and sustaining the church
 - d. He has reconciled guilty humanity you who were once hostile, doing evil - through His blood, we are reconciled to God.
 - e. He is the lover of your soul
 - iv. How does this increased knowledge come to us?
 - 1. Wherever believers' hearts are bound together in love.
 - 2. FF Bruce quote: "Paul emphasizes that the revelation of God cannot be properly known apart from the cultivation of brotherly love within the Christian community."
 - v. This results in a more profound knowledge of Christ. Wisdom and knowledge.
 - 1. Remember that people are trying to lead them to believe that there are other treasures of wisdom... plausible philosophies.
 - Truly understanding who Christ is protects us from plausible arguments.

- c. Paul restates his heart that though he is absent from them, he is present in spirit.
 - i. He delights in the order they have
 - ii. He encourages the firmness of their faith
