ANCHORED IN TRUTH

When I think about strength, I realize how misguided my previous understanding of it was. It was a worldly and man-centered perspective. As a man, it's easy to think, "I can handle this," "I can fix this," "I can overcome this," or "I can control this or that." However, if we're not Christ-centered, we fill that void with a selfish, man-centered limited strength.

Christ saus in Matthew 11:28. "Come to me all who are weary and burdened, and I will give you rest." This is true for all of us. We all carru burdens, and this fallen world is a constant source of weariness. When we realize our need for Christ and the gift of the Holy Spirit, who will be with us as believers forever (John 14:6), our eyes are opened, and our hearts are humbled to all His promises in scripture. The Spirit also provides us with the help we need to sustain us, as it says in Romans 8:26, even when we don't even know what we need.

Sadly few believers tap into the power of the Holy Spirit that indwells them. Many believers see the Holy Spirit as a mystical force rather than the third person in the Trinity. Such legalistic views of the Spirit disregard the work and power of the Spirit, while others charismatic views disregard the scriptures teaching of the spirit over misguided emotions. We must live under the authority of the Word through the power of the Spirit.

How can we do this? First, we can spend time in God's Word and prayer, acknowledging the power of the Spirit that is in us to continue to sanctify us. Second, we must expect change in ourselves if we're allowing the Spirit to work in us. We will see more fruits of the Spirit. Third, we should lean into the unexpected because the Spirit often leads us in His ways, not our own. For His ways are better than our misguided, selfish ways. For His strength, is the power that gives us strength.
