The Prayer Life of a Disciple Maker

There's a quiet strength in the life of a disciplemaker—a strength that doesn't come from charisma, clever words, or perfect plans, but from prayer. Not the hurried kind we squeeze in between emails, but the kind that roots us deep in the presence of God.

John Mark Comer reminds us that "prayer is not a place to perform but a place to be." It's where we lay down our striving and remember that making disciples is never about what we can accomplish, but what Jesus can do through us. In prayer, we slow down long enough to listen—to God's voice, to the Spirit's promptings, to the needs of the people we're walking with.

Max Lucado once wrote, "Our prayers may be awkward. Our attempts may be feeble. But since the power of prayer is in the One who hears it, not the one who says it, our prayers do make a difference." Isn't that freeing? You don't have to be eloquent to be effective. You just have to show up—with a willing heart.

A disciplemaker's prayer life is less about asking God to bless our plans and more about aligning our hearts with His. It's praying for the friend who's wrestling with faith, for the courage to share your story, for the wisdom to know when to speak and when to listen. It's inviting the Holy Spirit into the ordinary moments—conversations over coffee, text messages of encouragement, shared meals of grace.

I pray that even as we as a church take this two month journey into prayer, that each of you will rediscover the sacred rhythm of prayer. Let's create space to be still before God, trusting that He's shaping us into people who not only make disciples but who live deeply with Him.

You are a cup meant to be filled up with God. Only He can satisfy the longings of your soul... to know Him, to sit in the beauty of being known by Him. And then, as a natural byproduct of being filled, you will make Him known.

In the end, every true movement of disciple-making begins—and continues—on our knees.

On another note, I love standing at the back of the Sanctuary on Sundays, greeting people as they come to worship. Perhaps, like me, you've noticed a beautiful sight—more people arriving with wheelchairs, and more young families bringing their children. What a gift it is to see all generations gathering together to worship Jesus!

We are a church welcoming people on a spiritual journey to SEE Jesus and take a step of faith. To welcome people well, we want to ensure that everyone who enters our sanctuary can find a place to sit with their family. For most, that's simple—but for those with wheelchairs or strollers, finding space together can be a challenge.

To meet this need, we will be removing the back pew on each side in the sanctuary to create accessible space for families with wheelchairs and strollers. This small change opens the door wider for everyone to belong and participate fully in worship.

There's a saying that "the ground is level at the foot of the cross." Everyone—regardless of status, wealth, or ability—is invited to receive Jesus' free gift of salvation. Let's thank God together that we can make space, both physically and spiritually, for more families to SEE Jesus and take a step with us.

Because Jesus Makes us Family,

Session opened with prayer and focused on evaluating CPC's organizational structure and leadership effectiveness. We discussed strengths and weaknesses, exploring ways to increase member involvement in leadership roles, enhance discipleship and outreach, reduce ministry silos, and improve accountability across teams. Key questions centered on Session's primary purpose.

Session leaders took time to define our roles in spiritual oversight, shepherding, and organizational leadership for the church. We took time to emphasize the need for clarity in responsibility, authority, and accountability rather than governance for its own sake.

The meeting also addressed several operational matters, including urgent sanctuary lighting repairs presented by our worship leader Daniel. Session also discussed scheduling the Men's Breakfast for November, planning the Elder's Retreat for the New Year, and reviewing minor updates to staff job descriptions.

Financial discussions included updates on the roof and gym floor projects, a finance report, and finalizing next year's budget with prayers for increased giving and God's provision for the church's future needs. We ended our time with prayer for unity, and God's wisdom in how to navigate all these matters we discussed with grace, truth, and love for God and one another above all.

- **Center Kitchen Refrigerators:** After 30 years of use, the refrigerators in the gym kitchen failed and were replaced thanks to the help of Women's Ministry!
- **LED Screen & TVs Installed:** Praise God! The large LED screen and two TVs were successfully installed in the sanctuary—thank you to Leonard and Kathy Babyak for their invaluable tech skills and dedication in making this project a reality. These improvements enhance our ability to communicate, worship, and connect as one body.
- Railings in the Sanctuary: Jim Burke and Tony Perez installed the new safety railings on the front center steps leading to the stage —another step toward ensuring accessibility and care for all who worship with us.
- **Tree Trimming Project:** In June, volunteers led by Mike and Zach Schmit trimmed trees hanging over the Club Room roof, preventing potential damage and improving the longevity of the roof. Their hands-on care reflects faithful stewardship of God's buildings.
- Campus Clean-Up Day: In September, Scouts and other ministry partners joined forces to refresh and beautify our campus, exemplifying our heart to Share Life in service.

We are truly grateful to Tammy Sawyer for her faithful leadership of the Buildings & Grounds Team. This year also brought deep sadness with the passing of our beloved custodian, Scott Sawyer. His faithful service and joyful spirit will forever inspire us. We are profoundly thankful for the steady support of Jim Burke, William Jennings, and our summer temporary employees Alec Sanchez, Caleb Emmett, Fahim Rahimi, Evan Dickerson and Zach Schmit, along with numerous volunteers who have faithfully carried on this vital ministry of care and upkeep of the church campus. In an effort to cut down on expenses, we have hired a professional cleaning company and landscape company instead of hiring a second custodian.

Through every project, we've seen God's faithfulness—working through dedicated volunteers and staff to build not just facilities, but a community that reflects His love and care.


