Happy February all! I greet you in the name of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ: the one who gives life, sustains, and ushers salvation to the world. Grace and peace to each of you.

Did you know that it does not matter how many times we read God's story in His Word there is always something new that we did not grab hold of in prior readings? The Holy Spirit brings us fresh revelation each time we go to the Holy Scriptures that informs and directs our lives in amazing ways. The month of February, I have a healthy body on my mind. We are in the middle of our Daniel Plan series, and it is my hope that you are beginning to understand and grab hold of how important it is that we worship God with all of our being, and that includes how we treat our bodies. Our body, is God's gift to us, and we are stewards of it. Rick Warren the pastor of Saddleback Church says "we can reject, mistreat, protect, or perfect our body" Our attitude toward our physical health matters to God.

A key principal comes from Ecclesiastes 4:9 "Two are better than one, because they have a good return for their labor." (NIV) Every instance I have read this verse I have aligned with the strength for Christians to be in relationship to each other. Community is vital to our faith. Jesus tells Peter after the great profession of Jesus's identity "On this rock I will build my church."

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(Matt. 16:18, NIV). Here is where the revelation comes to the forefront (revelation meaning unveiling). We come together not in our strength so as to be more strong but we gather because of our weakness. It is in our weakness we realize our need for God's strength, in our weakness we depend on others! Paul tells the church in Corinth "...my power is made perfect in weakness" I think about how we describe Jesus in scripture. First God comes into the world not brandishing strength and power but helplessness and utter weakness. Jesus is "the Lamb of God" not a warhorse of God. God defeated the cosmic darkness of sin and death not with an overthrow of power but in Christ's willful surrender of power. This is huge!

I grew up watching wrestling and each participant that entered the ring had a signature power move that would undoubtedly end the match. God's signature power move was not one that displayed worldly strength and bravado but its antithesis. The "Sacrificial Lamb" is Jesus's signature move and through the cross of Christ we are brought together in our human weakness to be a community of faith in weakness so as to be made strong by God' Spirit.

With the Daniel Plan and our journey to lead healthy lives in worship of God, we acknowledge our weaknesses. We acknowledge our struggles, conflicts, and failings. But because of others who also have come into the fold under Jesus we can be raised up to success. Together in Christ through Christ, we are mighty. 1 Ptr 1:3 "God's divine power has us everything we need for life and godliness." (NIV) One of those gifts is the community of believers. The power of groups is vital in our lives. But it is often the most overlooked and underutilized gifts that the church offers. The Church was Jesus's idea. Jesus knows the importance of community, God exists in the Trinitarian community. When we gather in groups to do life it is our greatest strength because we acknowledge our weakness. Our success is not on ourselves but in God and God's family. The Daniel Plan emphasizes the need for group living. These are the folks who will offer compassion and mercy in our faults and speak truth to power for our success. Get into a group and do not try to live the faithful life in isolation.

We need people. Blessings, to each of you and may you be successful on the journey to better

health!


