In 1991, she married New York musician Steve Arm and the couple welcomed their first child, Allisyn, in 1996. Anji began working with Glendale City Church in 1999, putting her training in child development to use by teaching the toddler's Sabbath School classes. In 2002, Anji and Steve grew their family with their second daughter, Josie. They are a tight-knit bunch with a passion for the arts, and a deep adoration of animals and nature.

An avid adventurer, Anji upholds a remarkable birthday tradition of hiking Mount Whitney, the tallest mountain in the contiguous United States. She has summited 17 times since 2008. Her love for the outdoors led her to start the "Maniac Hiking Club," a group that ran for three years, exploring trails all over SoCal.

Anji is vegan for both her health and for animal rights. She loves learning about nutrition, with some of her favorite books on the subject including Your Body in Balance, Prevent and Reverse Heart Disease, Fiber Fueled, The China Study, and How Not To Die. She is a generous spirit, writing her name on each book in her extensive home library because of how frequently she lends them out to friends and family. Her compassion extends to animals in need; she often makes time in her jam-packed schedule to foster litters of kittens.

Along with conducting children's ministry classes for 26 years, Anji has assumed more responsibilities in the last two and a half years, now holding the title of Campus Administrator. She keeps services running smoothly from the shadows, proofing and printing the bulletin, making flyers for concerts, placing candles for 'day of remembrance', setting up tables for potluck, overseeing repairs, spot cleaning the carpets, getting fire extinguishers inspected, checking the alarm and emergency exit signs, making sure the pianos and organ get tuned, writing the monthly newsletter, running OpenTable and sending the weekly emails, cleaning up after each service, and so much more.
