Wildfire Safety Gravel Grant Available

Altadena homeowners recovering from the Eaton Fire now have access to a new Gravel Grant Program aimed at improving wildfire safety. The initiative, led by Global Emergency Relief, Recovery & Reconstruction (GER³) in partnership with Fire Safe Marin and CalFIRE, provides free gravel to help residents create a five-foot defensible space—known as "Zone 0"—around their homes. Zone 0 is considered the most critical buffer in protecting structures from wildfire damage. To qualify, residents must first clear all combustible materials near the home. Approved applicants will receive a voucher for gravel delivery from a

local supplier to replace these flammable materials with fire-resistant ground cover. The program reflects a growing effort to help fire-affected communities rebuild with resilience and reduce future wildfire risks.
