GETTING ACQUAINTED



Sam Guerrero

For 9 years, Sam Guerrero has enjoyed fellowshipping at Glendale City Church. Those attending Grace Sabbath School have often been blessed by his contributions. Recently, Sam reflected on how prison life deepened his spiritual walk. (Indeed, a monk's cloister is not unlike a prison cell.) Since not everyone has such an intriguing life story, it seems fitting to get better acquainted with our brother in Christ.

Sam grew up in the Philippines—first in Ilocos Norte, then at Northern Luzon Academy, Mountain View College, and Philippine Union College near Manila. Though he began pre-med, he graduated with a pre-law degree. During martial law under President Marcos, Sam was imprisoned for his involvement with the College Editors Guild of the Philippines, which had been labeled subversive. After an arduous release process, he was admitted to the College of Law in Manila.

In 1980, Sam immigrated to the U.S., joined the Navy, and served aboard ships in Hawaii and Japan. Following an honorable discharge, he worked in a variety of roles with law enforcement and federal agencies, including the LAPD, LA County Sheriff, the DA's Office, DOJ/INS, and CBP. His final position was as an immigration officer with Citizenship & Immigration Services. A lapse in judgment led to arrest, but instead of denial, Sam chose to seek clemency. Prison this time was different: he served in a camp, worked as a librarian, and studied at Bible College, eventually earning a BA in Pastoral Ministry.

Sam is married to Thelma Tordecilla, an RN at Kaiser Sunset who works night shifts. He has a daughter, Jochebed, and two sons, Jordan and Nile. His hobbies include reading theology and biographies, cooking, and gardening.


Thank you, Sam, for sharing how God has blessed you through hard times. May you continue to grow in your knowledge of Him and share that blessing with us!
