3 preliminaries

- 1. Death/suffering is the enemy (Rev 21:4).
- 2. All things work for good for those who love God (Rom 8:28).
- 3. Sometimes we'll never know why (Job).

Big Idea: God remains faithful even when I don't understand; so, I choose to live faithfully in all situations.

¹² Are you not from everlasting, O LORD my God, my Holy One? We shall not die. O LORD, you have ordained them as a judgment, and you, O Rock, have established them for reproof. ¹³ You who are of purer eyes than to see evil and cannot look at wrong, why do you idly look at traitors and remain silent when the wicked swallows up the man more righteous than he? ¹⁴ You make mankind like the fish of the sea, like crawling things that have no ruler. ¹⁵ He brings all of them up with a hook; he drags them out with his net; he gathers them in his dragnet; so he rejoices and is glad.

1. God's Character guarantees His faithfulness (vv. 12-14).

O LORD, you have ordained them as a judgment, and you, O Rock, have established them for reproof. ¹³ You who are of purer eyes than to see evil and cannot look at wrong, why do you idly look at traitors and remain silent when the wicked [Chaldean] swallows up the man more righteous [Israel] than he? ¹⁴ You make mankind like the fish of the sea, like crawling things that have no ruler. ¹⁵ He [the Chaldeans] brings all of them up with a hook; he drags them out with his net; he gathers them in his dragnet; so he rejoices and is glad.

Focus on God's Character more than your problem.

- i. From everlasting to everlasting (v. 12).
- ii. Holy One (v. 12).
- iii. Keeps his promises (v. 12).
- iv. Sovereign judge (v. 12).
- v. Our Rock (v. 12).
- vi. Establisher of kingdoms (v. 12).
- vii. Too pure to look at evil/wrong (v. 13).

In difficulty, remember, our Jesus:

- i. Understands our struggles (Heb 4:15).
- ii. Will wipe away every tear (Rev 21:4).
- iii. Guarantees our salvation (Eph 1:13-14).
- iv. Advocates for us (1Jn 2:1).
- v. Gives us Hope (1Ti 1:1).

2. Expect God's answer in God's time (vv. 2:1-3).



4 Reasons God waits ... when we think he should hurry!

- i. For someone's salvation (2Pt 3:9).
- ii. To mature a believer (James 1:2-4; Php 4:19).
- iii. So that God gets the glory (Jn 12:27-28).
- iv. Because God's plan is better (Rom 8:28).

These are not all the reasons, just some of them.



It's not a formula. We don't know how long we need to wait.

- 3. Live by faith (v. 2:4).
- ⁴ "Behold, his soul is puffed up; it is not upright within him, but the <u>righteous</u> shall live by <u>his</u> faith.

(cf. Rom 1:17; Gal 3:11; Heb 10:38)

Live by faith ... in real life.

- i. Live consistently when violence abounds, and justice is perverted (1:1-4).
- ii. Persevere in difficulty (1:5-11) even when we do not understand (12-17).
- iii. Let faith in God's answer conquer doubt of silence (2:1-3).
- iv. Seek to understand God's righteous judgment (2:4-20).
- v. Extol/Praise God's sovereign purpose (3:1-19).
