The Apostle Paul confirms the inspiration of Scripture in 2 Timothy 3:16-17... "All Scripture is breathed out by God and profitable for teaching, for reproof, for correction, and for training in righteousness, that the man of God may be complete, equipped for every good work."

The Apostle Peter also confirms that the Bible is inspired by God in 2 Peter 1:20-21... "...knowing this first of all, that no prophecy of Scripture comes from someone's own interpretation. For no prophecy was ever produced by the will of man, but men spoke from God as they were carried along by the Holy Spirit."

In Matthew 5:17-18, Jesus says... "Do not think that I have come to abolish the Law or the Prophets; I have not come to abolish them but to fulfill them. For truly, I say to you, until heaven and earth pass away, not an iota, not a dot, will pass from the Law until all is accomplished."

And no creature is hidden from his sight, but all are naked and exposed to the eyes of him to whom we must give account."

What other book in the world can do that? That's the power, that's the uniqueness of God's Holy Word, the Bible. What's so special about the Bible? So many things. More than we have time to discuss. But two of them is that the Bible is INSPIRED by God and that the Bible is UNIQUE, above and beyond any other writings that have ever existed.
