Why do people have a hard time not trying to earn their way to heaven? What part does our pride play into it?

Perhaps it sounds too exclusive to say that only Christianity is the way. Well, take that up with Jesus. He's the one who said it.

In John 14:6 He said, "I am the way, and the truth, and the life. No one comes to the Father except through me."

Yes, the gospel is exclusive in the sense that salvation is only available to those who embrace Jesus as Lord and Savior. But in reality, it is inclusive.

Salvation is available to, no matter the <u>color</u> of your skin, or what <u>gender</u> you are, or what you have <u>done</u> in your life.	
The gospel is available to all who realize they can't work for it. It's available to all who b it and r it. How do we do that?	
John 3:16 says, "For God so loved the world, that he gave his only Son, that whoever believes in him should not perish but have eternal life."	
Belief that saves requires r of sin first. Jesus said so in Mark 1:15, "repent and believe in the gospel." And how do we receive salvation?	
How we receive salvation	
"if you confess with your mouth that Jesus is Lord and believe in your heart that God raised him from the dead, you will be saved. For with the heart one believes and is justified, and with the mouth one confesses and is saved." Romans 10:9-10	
Receiving salvation happens when we <u>believe</u> in our <u>hearts</u> and with our <u>mouths</u> . We express to God repentance for sin, acknowledge belief in the death and resurrection of Jesus, and ask Him to be Lord and Savior of our lives.	
Another way of thinking of it is the "ABC's of Salvation." "A" A you're a sinner. "B" B Jesus died on the cross for those sins and rose from the dead. And "C" C Him as the leader of your life.	
It's really as simple as that. Maybe that's why Jesus said in the gospels that we must "believe like a child." How about you? Do you know your "ABC's"?
