And how we live flows out of what we believe. That was the primary theme of 1 Timothy, the letter Paul wrote to the young man he discipled, Timothy. He wrote in 1 Timothy 4:16a "Watch your life and doctrine closely."
Luke 16 gives us a great example from Jesus of the authority of Scripture. Jesus tells a story of a man who didn't believe on earth and the result was suffering torment in hell.
The man has a conversation with Abraham across a chasm that apparently separated those who died believing and those who died not believing (prior to Jesus opening heaven at His resurrection). The man begged to be able to go back and warn his unbelieving brothers.
But it says in Luke 16:29-31 "But Abraham said, 'They have Moses and the Prophets; let them hear them.' And he said, 'No, father Abraham, but if someone goes to them from the dead, they will repent.' He said to him, 'If they do not hear Moses and the Prophets, neither will they be convinced if someone should rise from the dead.'"

Jesus described the illumination of the Holy Spirit this way to His disciples in John 16:13-14... "When the Spirit of truth comes, he will guide you into all the truth, for he will not speak on his own authority, but whatever he hears he will speak, and he will declare to you the things that are to come. He will glorify me, for he will take what is mine and declare it to you."

In 1 Corinthians 2:9-10, 12, the Apostle Paul puts it this way..."But, as it is written, 'What no eye has seen, nor ear heard, nor the heart of man imagined, what God has prepared for those who love him'—these things God has revealed to us through the Spirit. For the Spirit searches everything, even the depths of God... Now we have received not the spirit of the world, but the Spirit who is from God, that we might understand the things freely given us by God."

We have been given the Bible for transformation not just information. As James put it in James 1:22-25 (NIV)... "Do not merely listen to the word, and so deceive yourselves. Do what it says. Anyone who listens to the word but does not do what it says is like someone who looks at his face in a mirror and, after looking at himself, goes away and immediately forgets

what he looks like. But whoever looks intently into the perfect law that gives freedom, and continues in it—not forgetting what they have heard, but doing it—they will be blessed in what they do."
