C.S. Lewis quote from "Mere Christianity"...

"You must make your choice. Either this man was, and is, the Son of God, or else a madman or something worse. You can shut him up for a fool, you can spit at him and kill him as a demon or you can fall at his feet and call him Lord and God, but let us not come with any patronising nonsense about his being a great human teacher."

If we hold the Bible to be true, we must also hold to the belief that Jesus is indeed _____.Jesus, and God's Word never gave us another option.

In John 10:30, Jesus is recorded as saying, "I and the Father are one." That is why the Jews wanted to stone him, as they said in v. 33, "you, being a man, make yourself God." Jesus also stated in John 8:58, "Truly, truly, I say to you, before Abraham was, I am."

The biblical authors also understood that Jesus is God. John said in John 1:1, "In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God."

Paul says of Him in Titus 2:13, "waiting for our blessed hope, the appearing of the glory of our great God and Savior Jesus Christ".

So we know who Jesus is, He is God. But What does Jesus? In answering the question, let's break it up into three different aspects: Before His incarnation, His incarnation, and His post-ascension.
Incarnation means " ". So, before Jesus came in the flesh, 2,000 years ago, what did He do?
Jesus was involved in the c of all things. John 1:3 says, "All things were made through him, and without him was not any thing made that was made."
And Hebrews 1:2 puts it this way, "but in these last days he has spoken to us by his Son, whom he appointed the heir of all things, through who also he created the world."
In addition to creating the world, Jesus helped I God's chosen people, the Israelites, during Old Testament times.
In this ministry, He served as Messenger to the people (Genesis 16; 22; 31). He also g and p Israel (Exodus 14; 23; 2 Kings 19).
Let's move on to the incarnation. John 1:14 says, "And the Word [Jesus] became flesh and dwelt among us, and we have seen his glory, glory as of the only Son from the Father, full of grace and truth."
J.I. Packer called the incarnation the "supreme mystery", how a holy God could be joined with sinful humanity and yet there be no presence of sin.
Jesus possessed, in that He was born from a; yet still possessed His, for it was a, and therefore, the sinful "seed of Adam" was not passed onto Him.
