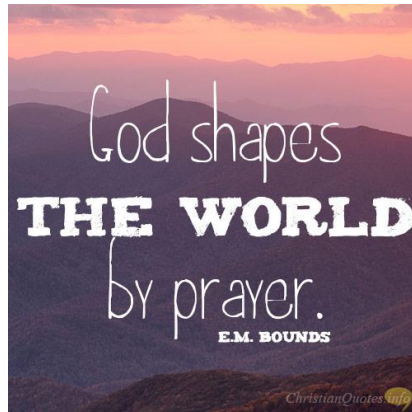

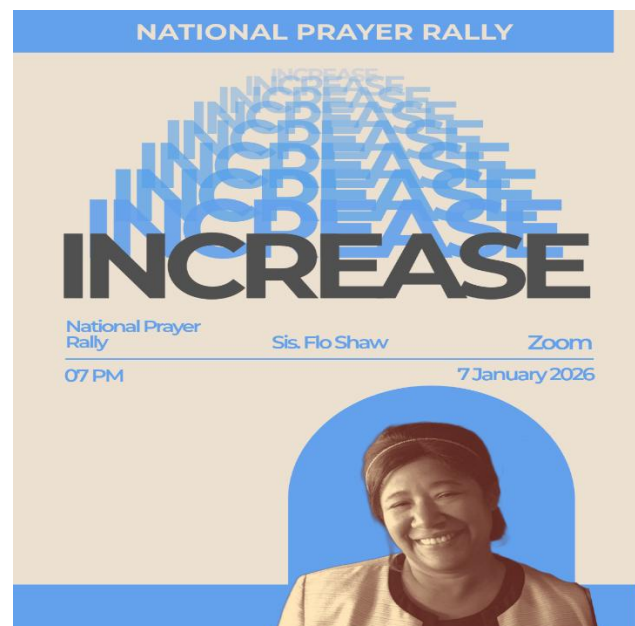
PRAYER REQUESTS:

Prayer Target City: Wolverhampton

Population: 251,000

The Wolverhampton district lies within the traditional coalfield area known as the Black Country and is situated northwest of its nearest neighbour Birmingham and forms the second largest part of the West Midlands conurbation.

History: Historically a part of Staffordshire, the city was founded in 985 and commonly recognised as being named after Lady Wulfrun, (Anglo Saxon for a high farm or enclosure), with the name Wulfrun used in the city for the Wulfrun Centre or for the Wulfrun Hall.

The city grew initially as a market town for the wool trade but grew rapidly in the Industrial Revolution with coal, iron ore, steel production, engineering and vehicle manufacturing.

Enoch Powell was dismissed from the Conservative Party's shadow cabinet in 1968 following his controversial "Rivers of Blood" speech in which he warned of massive civil unrest if mass immigration of black and Asian commonwealth inhabitants continued.

Demographics: According to the 2001 census, Wolverhampton has a relatively older population with a higher proportion of people aged over 60 years accounting for more than the number of children less than 15 years. The proportion of young people decreased by 7.4% in the previous 10 years compared with the national average rise of 1.7% in the population.

The 19th century saw immigration from Wales and Ireland following the Irish Potato Famine and in the 20th century from the Indian state of the Punjab.

Wolverhampton is today ethnically diverse with 24.6% of the city's population being of black or of minority ethnic origin and 22% of residents classifying themselves as non-white in the 2001 Census. The largest category being Indian at 23% which compares with a West Midlands average of 6.2% and an England and Wales average of 2.1%.

Employment: Traditionally, Wolverhampton's economy has been based on engineering and manufacturing, although the modern era has seen a large aerospace industry develop. The service sector now dominates with 74% of the population now employed in this area. The 2001 Census revealed that 62% of the population between the ages of 16 and 75 were economically active with 23,000 full time students at the University of Wolverhampton.

Religion: Wolverhampton is a multi-cultural city with an above average level of non-Christian religions. The 4th largest Sikh community in England and Wales accounts for 7.6% with Hindus and Buddhists also higher than the national average. In contrast the followers of Judaism and Islam are below the average for England and Wales.
