III.COURSE REQUIREMENTS

Course Assignments and Weight of Assignments

20% - Reading paper based on Thornton's English Spirituality

After reading Thornton's English Spirituality, write a 5-page paper discussing what you think are the most salient features of English spirituality that Thornton discusses. His goal is to re-orient pastoral ministry. Which aspects of his book seem most helpful for pastoral ministry today? Why?

20% - Reading paper based on A Study of Spirituality

After reading A Study of Spirituality, write a 5-page paper discussing which aspects of Christian spirituality you believe are most important and explaining why. Make sure your paper reflects your reading of this text.

60% - Final Paper

In 15 pages, discuss what aspects of a healthy Anglican spirituality seem present in North America today. What aspects seem lacking? Martin Thornton's goal was to reorient pastoral ministry. In what ways do you think Anglican spirituality today needs to be reoriented? Finally, Thornton believes that tradition + experimentation is a winning formula. In what ways should Anglican spirituality experiment today to be more effective?

Late Assignments and Absences

All assignments must be turned in on time. In the case of extraordinary circumstances, any deduction in grade is at the discretion of the professor, after the student has first consulted with the professor. Absences are especially disruptive in an intensive schedule such as that at Cranmer House. They will seriously impact the ability of the student to contribute to and learn from the class and should be avoided.
