Church! The liturgy is entirely contained within this booklet. In general, we stand (*) to sing, sit to listen, and kneel (†) to pray. **Boldface** indicates congregational participation. At Holy Communion, all baptized Christians who love our Divine Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ in sincerity and are living in peace and charity with their neighbors are invited to receive the Eucharist. Further instructions on how to receive Holy Communion or a blessing can be found beginning on page 31.

The Liturgy begins at 10am, ending around 11:25am, at which point the adults will enjoy a time of fellowship and refreshments, while the children and teens go immediately to their Catechesis classes. Around 11:45pm, adult catechesis will begin. Lunch and baptismal reception will follow Catechesis. May God bless you on this Lord's Day!

Storms and Rainbows

Mozart, Recordare, from Requiem

"Lord, save us! We're going to drown!" ... "You of little faith, why are you so afraid?" He rebuked the winds and waves; it was completely calm. (Matt 8: 25-6)

In 1974 I was in a small commercial fishing boat on the Aegean Sea, visiting the monasteries of the Holy Mountain in northern Greece. My companions were twelve personnel of the American Navy, whom I had met in Athens. Of a sudden, a violent storm descended upon us. 10-12 foot waves deluged our vessel. The boat was being tossed about like a feather in the wind. We sought shelter in the hold, fearing for our lives. We prayed. Then, as quickly as the storm had arisen, it ended.

"I have set my bow in the cloud, and it shall be a sign of the covenant between me and the earth...." (Genesis 9:13)

We went on deck, and were greeted by a 'trinity miracle' of rainbows, one on top of the other, all seven colors clearly visible in each. We were convinced it was a 'Noah' promise. We docked in the monastery harbor and, ascending the Holy Mountain, gave thanks at the 9th century Great Lavra monastery.

There will always be storms in our lives. Some storms we bring upon ourselves through force of ego or will. God visits our 'Jonah' rebellion in storms meant to correct our path. After the deluge He will then give us His rainbow of peace.

Others are Paul and Silas storms inflicted by other people or circumstances not of our choosing. They seek to keep us from our 'witness calling' by intimidation or fear. We trust Christ to calm the storm and still the waves as He did on the Sea of Galilee. He rebukes those who stand against His purposes if we call upon Him..

Don't worry about anything, but in everything, through prayer and petition with thanksgiving, present your requests to God. And the peace of God, which surpasses all understanding, will guard your hearts and minds in Christ Jesus.

(Philippians 4:6-7)

Without storms there can be no rainbows. Every storm in our life with Christ will be followed by His covenant rainbow of peace and promise. Whether self-inflicted or provoked by others, storms can serve a divine purpose if we choose to see the hand of God in them. He corrects our wayward path; He redirects us toward His calling. His peace will form an arch of covering from horizon to horizon in our journey, bringing us safely at last into His eternal haven.

After these things I looked, and behold, a door opened in heaven . . . and a rainbow was around the throne" (Revelation 4:1,3)

†The Decalogue

OD spake these words, and said: I am the LORD thy God; Thou shalt have none other gods but me.

Lord, have mercy upon us, and incline our hearts to keep this law.

Thou shalt not make to thyself any graven image, nor the likeness of any thing that is in heaven above, or in the earth beneath, or in the water under the earth; thou shalt not bow down to them, nor worship them; for I the LORD thy God am a jealous God, and visit the sins of the fathers upon the children, unto the third and fourth generation of them that hate me; and show mercy unto thousands in them that love me and keep my commandments.

Lord, have mercy upon us, and incline our hearts to keep this law.

Honour thy father and thy mother; that thy days may be long in the land which the LORD thy God giveth thee.

Thou shalt not steal.


Lord, have mercy upon us, and incline our hearts to keep this law.



At the announcement of the Gospel, it is customary to mark your forehead, lips, and heart with the shape of a Cross, praying God would give you grace to know +, speak +, and love + the Gospel.

Holy Baptism

HATH these Children been already baptized, or no? Godparents: **No.**

DEARLY beloved, forasmuch as our Saviour Christ saith, None can enter into the Kingdom of God, except he be regenerate and born anew of Water and of the Holy Ghost; I beseech you to call upon God the Father, through our Lord Jesus Christ, that of his bounteous mercy he will grant to these Children that which by nature they cannot have; that they may be baptized with Water and the Holy Ghost, and received into Christ's holy Church, and be made living members of the same.

Let us pray.

ALMIGHTY and immortal God, the aid of all who need, the helper of all who flee to thee for succour, the life of those who believe, and the resurrection of the dead; We call upon thee for these children, that they, coming to thy holy Baptism, may receive remission of sin, by spiritual regeneration. Receive them, O Lord, as thou hast promised by thy well-beloved Son, saying, Ask, and ye shall have; seek, and ye shall find; knock, and it shall be opened unto you. So give now unto us who ask; let us who seek, find; open the gate unto us who knock; that these children may enjoy the everlasting benediction of thy heavenly washing, and may come to the eternal kingdom which thou hast promised by Christ our Lord. **Amen.**

THEY brought young children to Christ, that he should touch them: and his disciples rebuked those that brought

them. But when Jesus saw it, he was much displeased, and said unto them, Suffer the little children to come unto me, and forbid them not: for of such is the kingdom of God. Verily I say unto you, Whosoever shall not receive the kingdom of God as a little child, he shall not enter therein. And he took them up in his arms, put his hands upon them, and blessed them.

AND now, we being persuaded of the good will of our heavenly Father toward these children declared by his Son Jesus Christ; let us faithfully and devoutly give thanks unto him and say,

ALMIGHTY and everlasting God, heavenly Father, We give thee humble thanks, That thou hast vouchsafed to call us to the knowledge of thy grace, and faith in thee: Increase this knowledge, And confirm this faith, in us evermore. Give thy Holy Spirit to these children That they may be born again, And be made heirs of everlasting salvation; Through our Lord Jesus Christ, Who liveth and reigneth with thee and the Holy Spirit, Now and forever. Amen.

DEARLY beloved, ye have brought these children here to be baptized; ye have prayed that our Lord Jesus Christ would vouchsafe to receive them, to release them from sin, to sanctify them with the Holy Ghost, to give them the kingdom of heaven, and everlasting life.

Dost thou, therefore, in the name of these children, renounce the devil and all his works, the vain pomp and glory of the world, with all covetous desires of the same,

and the sinful desires of the flesh, so that thou wilt not follow, nor be led by them?

Godparents: (facing West) I renounce them all; and, by God's help, will endeavor not to follow, nor be led by them.

Dost thou believe all the Articles of the Christian Faith, as contained in the Apostles' Creed?

Godparents: I do.

Wilt thou be baptized in this Faith?

Godparents: That is my desire.

Wilt thou then obediently keep God's holy will and commandments, and walk in the same all the days of thy life?

Godparents: I will, by God's help.

Having now, in the name of these children, made these promises, will ye also on your part take heed that they learn the Creed, the Lord's Prayer, and the Ten Commandments, and all other things which a Christian ought to know and believe, to the soul's health?

Godparents: I will, by God's help.

Will ye take heed that these children, so soon as sufficiently instructed, be brought to the Bishop to be confirmed by him?

Godparents: I will, God being my helper.

O MERCIFUL God, grant that like as Christ died and rose again, so these children may die to sin and rise to newness of life. **Amen.**

Grant that all sinful affections may die in them, and that all things belonging to the Spirit may live and grow in them. Amen.

Grant that they may have power and strength to have victory, and to triumph, against the devil, the world, and the flesh. **Amen.**

Grant that whosoever is here dedicated to thee by our office and ministry, may also be endued with heavenly virtues, and everlastingly rewarded, through thy mercy, O blessed Lord God, who dost live, and govern all things, world without end. **Amen.**

The Lord be with you.

All: And with thy spirit.

Lift up your hearts.

All: We lift them up unto the Lord.

Let us give thanks unto our Lord God.

All: It is meet and right so to do.

IT is very meet, right, and our bounden duty, that we should give thanks unto thee, O Lord, Holy Father, Almighty, Everlasting God, for that thy dearly beloved Son Jesus Christ, for the forgiveness of our sins, did shed out of his most precious side both water and blood; and gave commandment to his disciples, that they should go teach

WE receive these children into the congregation of Christ's flock; and do sign them + with the sign of the Cross, in

token that hereafter they shall not be ashamed to confess the faith of Christ crucified, and manfully to fight under his banner, against sin, the world, and the devil; and to continue Christ's faithful soldiers and servants unto their life's end. Amen.

SEEING now, dearly beloved brethren, that these children are regenerate, and grafted into the body of Christ's Church, let us give thanks unto Almighty God for these benefits; and with one accord make our prayers unto him, that these children may lead the rest of their lives according to this beginning.

OUR Father, who art in heaven, hallowed be thy Name. Thy kingdom come. Thy will be done on earth, As it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread. And forgive us our trespasses, As we forgive those who trespass against us. And lead us not into temptation; But deliver us from evil. For thine is the kingdom, and the power, and the glory, for ever and ever. Amen.

WE yield thee hearty thanks, most merciful Father, that it hath pleased thee to regenerate these children with thy Holy Spirit, to receive them for thine own children, and to incorporate them into thy holy Church. And humbly we beseech thee to grant, that they, being dead unto sin, may live unto righteousness, and being buried with Christ in his death, may also be partaker of his resurrection; so that finally, with the residue of thy holy Church, they may be inheritors of thine everlasting kingdom; through Christ our Lord. Amen.

THE Almighty God, the Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, of whom the whole family in heaven and earth is named; Grant you to be strengthened with might by his Spirit in the inner man; that Christ dwelling in your hearts by faith, ye may be filled with all the fulness of God. **Amen.**



So God loved the world, that he gave his only-begotten Son, to the end that all that believe in him should not perish, but have everlasting life. St. John iii. 16.






†Preface



Instructions for taking Holy Communion

If you are baptized into God's family and you sincerely love Christ, then you are welcome to partake of His Sacrament, whether you are a member of the Reformed Episcopal Church or another Christian denomination. To partake by the Common Cup, simply ingest the consecrated host that is placed in your palm. To partake by Intinction (where the consecrated host is dipped in the Precious Blood and placed upon your tongue), leave the consecrated host in your palm. If you are not receiving Holy Communion today, either because you are not baptized or for conscience's sake, you are still invited forward to receive a blessing. Indicate this preference by crossing your arms over your chest. Baptized children are welcome to receive Holy Communion if that is the practice and desire of the parents. If you have a severe gluten allergy, you may receive consecrated gluten-free hosts in the small section to the far right of the Communion rail. If you are returning to church after a long time away, you are encouraged to wait to receive Communion until you speak to one of the clergy. Instead, receive a blessing at the rail.


