Psalm 37:3-6

3 Trust in the Lord, and do good; Dwell in the land, and feed on His faithfulness.

4 Delight yourself also in the Lord, And He shall give you the desires of your heart.

5 Commit your way to the Lord, Trust also in Him, And He shall bring it to pass.

6 He shall bring forth your righteousness as the light, And your justice as the noonday. 7 Rest in the Lord, and wait patiently for Him...

- Prayer reshapes what I WANT, how I SEE, and who I TRUST.
- God is far more interested in shaping my HEART than changing my SITUATION.

Matthew 6:10-11

10 Your kingdom come. Your will be done On earth as it is in heaven. 11 Give us this day our daily bread.

1) Prayer doesn't change God's will to fit OURS—it changes us to trust HIS.

3 Trust in the Lord, and do good; Dwell in the land, and feed on His faithfulness.

- Prayer Starts with SURRENDER, Not Requests
- Prayer Aligns Our DESIRES with God's Design

2) Prayer is learning to want what God knows I NEED.

4 Delight yourself also in the Lord, And He shall give you the desires of your heart. 5 Commit your way to the Lord, Trust also in Him, And He shall bring it to pass.

- God's Kingdom Reorders Our PRIORITIES.
- We want answers; God wants TRANSFORMATION.
- Submission PRECEDES Supply.

3) Prayer teaches us to trust God's PROVISION and submit to God's PURPOSE.

5 Commit your way to the Lord, Trust also in Him, And He shall bring it to pass.

6 He shall bring forth your righteousness as the light, And your justice as the noonday. 7 Rest in the Lord, and wait patiently for Him:

- Daily Bread Is an Act of FAITH.
- Worry comes when we want CONTROL instead of TRUST.
- When we seek God's will first, we discover God's PROVISION is enough.
- Prayer isn't informing God; It's forming TRUST in the One who already knows.
