Psalm 94:18-19 (NIV)

I recently read that the part of the brain that controls our emotions (fear, anger, anxiousness, joy, contentment, and love, etc...) is called the limbic system and it's buried deep inside the mind. You'll notice that the first three emotions L listed are the opposite of the second list of three. According to studies, the limbic system struggles to run two opposite emotions at the same time. In other words, I can't be anxious and joyful at the same time. I can't be fearful and content. at the same time. If that is true it seems like fear, anger, and anxiousness are running away with the prize in our culture today. Perhaps you can relate?

Enter God's Word. You know, God, the One who created everything, including you. The One who knit you together in your mother's womb (Psalm 139). The One who instructs you in His it

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pure joy when you are facing trials (James 1:2-4). The One who instructs us not to fear and the He who knows all our anxious thoughts. God's Word reminds us to step back from our chaotic emotions to allow room for the other emotions to breathe. Be still and know that He is God (Psalm 46:10)

To be still is to choose God. It allows your God-made limbic system the chance to run a different emotional program: Joy, Hope, and Love. When you're fearful, angry, or anxious you won't notice the beauty that is all around you. Whether it's the beauty of creation or the wonderful ways God has blessed your life. Fear, Anger, and Anxiousness will always lead you to complain and see the bad in your life. That only leads to sorrow and despair.

But Joy, Contentment, and Love will let hope flourish and you will begin to notice the good in your life. The joy of the Lord is seeing a beautiful Tennessee hillside in the fall. It looks like every color of creation is represented in the changing season. God made that...God made you. God sees you. You're gonna be okay.

Psalm 94:18-19 is a reminder that God is present with us when we are slipping into negative emotions. We must choose to be still and acknowledge His presence in those anxious times. Don't let your limbic system run in the wrong direction. I know that can often be difficult to do, but the Psalmist reminds us that the consolation of the Lord will bring us joy. Choose joy. And enjoy the fall weather.

Worry. We all do it, even as we tell someone else don't do it and Philippians 4:6 says don't worry...about anything. Easier said than done right?

However, we can forget what follows the command "do not be anxious about anything" but in everything. The "but in everything" shows there is a solution coming for the problem we ALL have, adults and kids alike. And saying, "don't worry" is not the part we need to hear most but instead, we need to hear and live out the "but in everything." It is after those three words we are told how to respond to our worry. Pray and petition God with our worries. Praise God andthank him for his faithfulness in our worry. God already knows we are worried, and he also knows what we are worried about. What he wants, is for us to call out to him! Call out to him like a child calling for their mother or father. No matter the hour, no matter the worry, just call out to him. When we do, He promises, that the peace of God which goes beyond anything in this world will protect our heart and our mind,

of which the enemy wants so desperately to destroy. We call...and *God protects*. Satan on the other hand wants us to spin on that hamster wheel of worry, telling us to focus on our circumstances, fears, and anxious thoughts. He wants to keep us in the chaos. But God... says call out, and I will steady your heart and mind. I will give you peace that makes no sense.

Like us, our kids have worries too. They may not be as life altering as adult worries, but they may alter their life if left without guidance on how to respond to their worry. Parents, we have been called to train our children, to lead them and guide them in the way of the Lord. God never said we wouldn't have troubles to worry about, "I have told you these things, so that in me you may have peace. In this world you WILL have trouble. But take heart! I have overcome the world." John 16:33 but he also did not leave us here without the solution. So, next time you or your child is worried, remember the but in everything and together pray your worries to your Father who is always ready to listen and feel the peace of Jesus!

Update from Pastor John George:

Greetings to all of you in
the precious name of the
Lord. It's been a small
while since I am coming



to you with an update of New Hope
Bible College. It was only God's grace
that we were able to continue this
work after the Covid-19 pandemic. Two
years ago we started a graduate
program, M.Div (Master of Divinity).
The first batch will graduate in
February 2024. Currently we have 24
students on campus and another 20
students online. Our B.Th course has
only two batches, because we lost one
batch during the Covid pandemic.

Our previous graduates are working in different parts of India and bringing lost souls to Jesus Christ. They are labouring in a very hostile environment not even counting their lives as precious. Today, one of our pastors who graduated from the bible school several years ago was attacked by a group of anti-christians. He was doing an open air meeting along with other pastors in his team. Kindly pray for Pastor Sunny and his co-workers.

Back in May of this year, totally trusting in the Lord, we started an expansion of the college building, an additional floor above the existing third level. This will help to accommodate students with more dormitories. Our Lord was so gracious to us, that we have finished most of

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the work. We still have a distance to go forward to finish it up, which we are hoping and praying for by the end of October 2023. Kindly keep this in your daily prayers.

I am planning to go back to India on October 2nd for a few months and seek your earnest prayer for divine providence and protection. Kindly continue to pray for the mission fields in India especially for more labourers to harvest in His field.

We would like to thank you for your prayer and generosity which you have shown to this humble work of the Lord over the past several years, and it is our prayer that the Lord may reward you in


A Book You Should Read:

Recently, I had Jeff Allen on my podcast to talk about his new book 'Are We There Yet? My Journey From a Messed Up to Meaningful Life." The opening chapters introduce the reader to a tortured man and his disdain for life. Jeff looked for meaning in all the wrong places. Money, drugs, and alcohol couldn't heal an anger inside of him that often turned to blinding rage. His nationally known comedy act became filled with anger and bitterness toward his wife and marriage. The jokes were a product of their homelife, which often left his wife

Tami in tears. In one particular argument Jeff stood on a stool and screamed at Tami until she crumbled to the ground in defeat. This style of "living" was a learned behavior from Jeff's childhood days in Chicago, and now he was inflicting the same damage to his wife and family. This story and many others are very difficult to read in the first half of the book.

Andy Andrews wrote the foreword to the book and he cautions the reader to push through the difficult moments because the second half of the book will introduce you to a whole new man. In a way that only God can, Jeff has an encounter with the Lord that will lift him out of his "meaningless" life and into a Christ-following meaningful life. The story becomes one of salvation, healing, and reconciliation. I received this book five days before my conversation with Jeff on the podcast. I finished the book in four. It is truly inspirational.



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
