

There Are No Shortcuts

Matthew 4:8-9 (NIV)

Again, the devil took him to a very high mountain and showed him all the kingdoms of the world and their splendor. "All this I will give you," he said, "if you will bow down and worship me."

Shortcuts can be so enticing.

Proverbs 14:12 tells us there is a way that seems right to a man but in the end it leads to destruction, and destruction often awaits at the end of shortcuts. God's plans and timing is perfect, shortcuts are our way

of trying to speed up God's timing and control the process.

Several years ago I was on vacation

with my family in Orlando, FL. We had dinner reservations at a restaurant in Disney Springs called T-Rex. I parked the car in a garage that was closest to the restaurant because there was a torrential downpour. I mean the rain was coming down sideways! Now, I have always prided myself on having a strong sense of direction. In my family I'm known as "the

human compass".
But on this day my
compass would fail
me in an extraordinary way.

When we came out of the parking garage and stood under the canopy,

the pouring rain presented us with a decision. We could run out into the rain

and go straight on a walkway that was ahead of us, or, we could take an immediate right turn and choose a walkway that appeared to head in the wrong direction. How did I know it was the wrong direction? Well, I could clearly see the T-Rex smoke stack on the other side of some stores, and the walkway that was laid out straight ahead of us clearly led to the restaurant. So I made

the decision for the family, "Let's go straight ahead!"
"But dad!" One of my
Children shouted, "The sign says we should go to the right!" It was too late. I already started running straight into the rain and my family had no choice but to follow.

In my arrogant mind I had found the shortcut! This decision immediately became a disaster as the once straight walkway was now filled with twists and turns. At one point we


were running in the opposite direction of the restaurant! What should have been 10 seconds of running in the pouring rain now became a five-minute expedition of screaming and yelling at each other! We eventually made it to T-Rex but by that time we were absolutely drenched. To make matters worse, the restaurant was freezing! When we were seated the family just sat in angry, shivering silence. The shortcut was a disaster! As we left the restaurant we chose the

walkway we should have taken in the first place, and wouldn't you know it, that sign by the parking garage was right. The walkway that went to the right would have taken us to the restaurant in less than 10 seconds. Ugh!!! It was a shortcut that seemed right to me, but in the end led to destruction.

The devil will often present us with shortcuts that seem right. Consider the ramifications of the temptation that was presented to Jesus in our scripture for

> today. Satan took Jesus to a high mountain and showed him all the kingdoms of the world. "All this I will give to you if you will bow down and worship me," he offered. Think about this for a moment. The people of Israel believed that their Messiah would come and bring peace as a conquering King who would rule on an earthly throne. His reign would end all oppression and His majesty would have no

end. The devil was offering Jesus a shortcut that would give the people exactly what they wanted their Messiah to be. Here you go, Jesus. A straight path to a throne that will cause people to love you, worship you, and become the king they've always wanted. All you need to do is deviate from your Father's plan and bow down to me. This may be the greatest shortcut (temptation) ever presented. Remember that the next time

you think Jesus doesn't know what it feels like to face temptation.

In essence, the devil was offering Jesus a path to an earthly throne that didn't include scourging, a crown of thorns, being spit upon, beatings, a cross, and NO DEATH! It's the shortcut dreams are made of. The only problem was the shortcut wasn't God's way, and when it's not God's way it's the wrong way. I'm so glad Jesus didn't take shortcuts. His response to Satan is the perfect example for us: Jesus said to him, "Away from me, Satan! For it is written: 'Worship the Lord your God, and serve him only." Matthew 4:10-11 (NIV). Jesus knew that his purpose and mission was to be rejected, bruised for our transgressions, crushed for our iniquities, and that his path to an eternal throne was through a death that would lead to resurrection!

Are you quick to look for shortcuts? Our desire to take shortcuts are often a sign of impatience and questioning God. The temptation to "go there" and "get there faster" is strong. My friend, I pray that you will resist this temptation. There are no shortcuts. They only appear to be, but the decision to try one will most likely leave you stranded in the rain.

tion in the Angel Tree; we requested 80 children, yet our congregation responded in a big way and supported a total of 166 children! Praise the Lord. The team sincerely appreciates everyone for their selfless generosity.

In addition, the Missions team has been receiving updates from many of the ministries which NHCC supports. This month, we are featuring two ministries: First Priority Nashville, a local ministry led by Steve Cherrico, centered on youth leading Christian clubs in schools to spread the gospel, and a brief note from CRU Athletes in Action in Ukraine led by Andrey and Yulia Sheplenko, focused on soccer events to introduce boys and girls to Jesus.

Finally, we continue to pray for these ministries, that God empowers them, blesses them, and turns His face towards them as they do God's work each and every day.

What a year it has been! Because of your prayers and support, First Priority Greater Nashville has seen tremendous growth in 2023. The time and resources that you provided have allowed for us to impact students on school campuses across Middle Tennessee. We have hired two full-time Area Directors, Jacob Sharp and Ryan McMichael, who are our "boots on the ground" in Davidson, Rutherford, Williamson and Maury Counties.

In 2023, our team saw hundreds of students trained through FP Clubs to share the gospel with their peers. We also saw an increased partnership with the local Church as we built networks of local support for those on school campus clubs. We held our annual Pray4Students Weekend in early August where over 2,000 Christ followers gathered and prayed in the name of Jesus on local campuses for the students, teachers and administration. What a difference it makes to be able to start the school year off with united prayer over a school campus! (John 17:20 & 21)

My favorite story from this past year comes from a school that our team has led prayer over for 10+ years during the above mentioned Pray4StudentsTN. In that time, we have not only prayed for the school and its leadership, but also that a group of students would grab hold of a burden for their classmates. This year that high school launched their first ever FP Club with 7

morning! I was reminded of these verses from Lamentations recently as I listened to a dear one in my life in another state telling me about her broken marriage and her broken heart. "Because of the

Lord's great love we are not consumed, for his compassions never fail. They are new every morning; great is your faithfulness."

This past year has been a great year for our high school group here at New Hope. From summer camp to pool parties to bonfire nights, we have had a lot of time to build relationships between myself, the students in the youth group, and the new volunteer team that we introduced this last year.

Our youth group has seen a lot of growth, and in more ways than one. This growth is not just in the numbers of students here, but we have seen real growth in their relationships with Jesus. I am extremely proud of our students for their commitment to growing their relationship with God, as well as their commitment to each other and helping each other in their walks with Christ. They have also done a great job in stepping up and bringing new people to church so that they can encounter Jesus!

This past summer, our numbers for the high school group went down a little, as they always do in the summer. We still had a good amount of students, but getting them to all show up at once gets a little difficult due to sports, vacations, and things of that nature. So, I gave them a challenge: By the end of the year, I wanted them to get 50 high schoolers here at New Hope in one night. This was a huge challenge, but in October, they did it! We had about 30

new students here that had never been to New Hope before. One new student even ended up giving their life to Christ! Our average high school youth group numbers have jumped up about 50-60% after this night.

Every time we are on our month-long break from Sunday morning small group, I have had students step up and offer to lead small group for that month. I could not be happier to see our students take the initiative to grow in Christ together, outside of our scheduled meeting times for youth group.

Like I said, this has been a great year for our high school group. We have had multiple students get saved, as well as multiple students get baptized this past year. We have seen new faces get brought into the youth group, and even some old faces come back into it. I have a new, amazing volunteer team that does so many wonderful things for the youth group. Most importantly, we have seen our students grow in a real, intimate relationship with God.

I believe that God has a lot of good things in store for the high-schoolers over this upcoming year. I pray that God will continue to do great things for this group of students and that He will continue to meet them right where they are.
