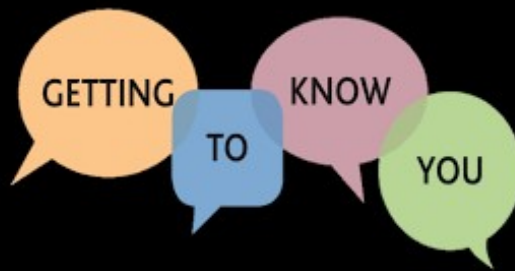

Lesson 3: Loving Together



- Think about what do you think a Christian...
 - Looks like= what they wear, how they present themselves, their style/aesthetic (example: a cross necklace because they want to show others that they love Jesus)
 - Sounds like= the types of things they say (example: Can I pray for you? Because they care for you)
 - Acts like= the way they behave, what they do (example: prayer before meals because they want to thank God for the food)
 - Posts like= what they share on social media and in texts (example: Christian music because they like those songs)
- Oftentimes we are quick to categorize, or define people by how they look, what they say, or even how they act. If this is the world that we live in, where our appearance, words, actions, and posts are used to classify and define us, then how can we tell whether someone is a follower of Christ? How are we showing others that we are followers of Christ?



WHAT DOES A CHRISTIAN LOOK LIKE? SOUND LIKE? ACT LIKE? POST LIKE?

- For thousands of years before Jesus, the people of God lived by a set of rules—called commands and laws—that set them apart from the rest of the world. You would know someone was a follower of God if the person lived by these commands.
- Did anyone list qualities of themselves? Do you identify as a Christian? How do you look, sound, act, and post?
- Christians are not perfect. In fact, that is one thing that defines us, our sin is why God sent his only Son to Earth to save us from our sins. God knows that we make mistakes, we have faults, we may dress, talk, act, or post in ways that aren't always aligning with the teachings of Jesus, but if we come to Him in for forgiveness, He freely gives it to us. In Jesus's time, when came, He refocused everyone on God's way of life and summed up all of the laws and commands in what was considered a "New Commandment."

LOVE/LOVED= pink...13 mentions

COMMAND/COMMANDMENT= yellow...6 mentions

John 13:34-35

34 I give you a new **commandment**, that you **love** one another. Just as I have **loved** you, you also should **love** one another. 35 By this everyone will know that you are my disciples, if you have **love** for one another."

John 15:9-17

9 As the Father has **loved** me, so I have **loved** you; abide in my **love**. 10 If you keep my **commandments**, you will abide in my **love**, just as I have kept my Father's **commandments** and abide in his **love**. 11 I have said these things to you so that my joy may be in you and that your joy may be complete.

12 "This is my **commandment**, that you **love** one another as I have **loved** you. 13 No one has greater **love** than this, to lay down one's life for one's friends. 14 You are my friends if you do what I **command** you. 15 I do not call you servants any longer, because the servant does not know what the master is doing, but I have called you friends, because I have made known to you everything that I have heard from my Father. 16 You did not choose me, but I chose you. And I appointed you to go and bear fruit, fruit that will last, so that the Father will give you whatever you ask him in my name. 17 I am giving you these **commands** so that you may **love** one another.

2. How do LOVE and COMMANDS balance each other out?



What would Jesus post?

- It's most often easy for us to love those who love us, even when they annoy us. It's more difficult to love people we don't know or who we don't like. However, this is the kind of love that Jesus had for others and what He calls his followers to exhibit. So, when you think of a Christian, start with Jesus...emulate His way of life (just maybe not his looks, I'm not sure desert-chic is in right now). The point is, we should be able to be identified as Christians because of our love for others.
- Stop and think as you go through your day...
 - What would Jesus say?
 - What would Jesus do?
 - What would Jesus post?

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Lesson 4: Belonging Together



- As you know, there is more to being a Christian than belonging to a church. The most profound part of being a Christian is that you belong to God.
