

Acts Chapter 27-28 – Strength in a Storm 11/2/2025 Reflection Questions

- In Acts 23:11, Paul was told that he must testify before the emperor in Rome. In Acts 27:20, Paul gave up hope that he would make it out of the storm alive. Have there been times in your life when a "storm" was so strong that they make you doubt what you once knew to be true?
 - Was your faith ever renewed at that time in your life?
- 2. Comment on this statement, "God's promises are not canceled by storms; they're often fulfilled through them."
- 3. What can we learn about decision-making when worldly experts disagree with godly counsel?
- 4. How does this storm account parallel the storms or crises we face in life?
- 5. Discuss this statement, "Sometimes God's grace brings an immediate breakthrough; other times, His grace gives us the strength to endure until the breakthrough comes."
- 6. How can we hold on to faith when the outcome is only partly revealed?
- 7. How important do you think it is to live out this statement, "Focus on what God is doing, not on what He is not doing"?
- 8. In Acts 28:4, after Paul was bitten by a snake, the Malta islanders concluded that he must be a murderer. The irony is that Paul's past included persecution and death of Christians. Discuss this statement, "God's grace enables us to move past what used to define us."
- 9. Comment on this quote: "You can't judge someone's spiritual standing by what they're currently going through."
- 10. What can we learn from Paul in Acts 28:5 when he simply shakes off the poisonous snake and goes on with life?
- 11. How might this statement be true in your own life: "Whether you realize it or not, there are a lot of people who are depending on you to get through your storm."
