- If self-sacrifice is the true power of God, then how should we act in this life? In what 8. ways is self-sacrifice difficult in our culture?
- Do you think the idea that Christians will be raptured out of the world before things get 9. really bad reflects an escapist type of theology? Why is it important to focus on our Kingdom work here on Earth? Does the final scene in the book of Revelation include Christians getting called up to heaven or of heaven coming down to Earth?
