Isaiah 6 – An Undivided Life 09/28/2025 Reflection Questions

1. Describe a time in your life when a disruption drew you to the Lord? How did both Isaiah and Uzziah experience disruption in their own lives?
2. When in your life have you felt like you were butter spread across too much toast, or had too many irons in the fire?
3. Why was it important for Isaiah to see the Lord “sitting on the throne” during the year of King Uzziah’s death? What does “sitting on the throne” symbolize?
4. How did Isaiah initially respond to what he saw in the heavenly throne room vision?
5. Have you ever felt undone before God's presence or holiness? If so, how did you respond or how did God meet you there?
6. What is the significance of the seraphim crying, “Holy, Holy, Holy” three times and what does it show us about God’s character?
7. How does repentance draw us singularly to the Lord? What did Isaiah’s repentance look like? Why do you think Isaiah specifically mentions being a man of “unclean lips”?
8. How does the Lord refresh us after repentance?
9. How can we make ourselves available to the Lord? Which is hardest for you to give God first: your time, your money, your willingness?
10. Can you personally relate to God’s question to Isaiah, “Whom shall I send?”
11. What does Isaiah's immediate response, “Here am I. Send me!” tell us about his transformation from the throne room vision?

12. What does this account in Isaiah chapter 6 teach us about the importance of faithfulness to God, even when results are not immediate or necessarily positive?
