### **“Advancing into New Territory” Reflection Questions 1/11/2026**

1. Did any of these descriptions of “new territory” resonate with you?
  - Breakthroughs you have not claimed
  - Unfulfilled promises from God
  - Unrealized potential in your life
  - Unfulfilled vision for your life
2. What contrast does Romans 12:2 make between "not conforming" and "being transformed"? How does that contrast relate to moving toward something rather than just away from something?
3. In Joshua 1:2-3, the Lord says to Joshua: “The time has come for you to lead these people, the Israelites, across the Jordan River into the land I am giving them. I promise you what I promised Moses: ‘Wherever you set foot, you will be on land I have given you.’”  
How are the following themes revealed in this passage?:
  - God’s promise
  - His timing
  - Our faith response

Describe a faith response or a step of faith that you had to take in your life.
4. What did the microphone illustration show about consecration and being set apart “from something” and set apart “to something”?
5. In the statement “Consecration is an invitation, not a forced requirement,” can you think of examples from Scripture of people who responded positively to God’s invitation and those who did not?  
How does this relate to God’s sovereignty and our free will?
6. How was the statement, “Consecration does not need to know the outcomes of the sacrifices of the commitment,” true in the lives of Abraham and Hannah? What does this reveal about trust and our own need for control and certainty of outcomes?
7. Comment on this statement: “On the other side of your consecration is the best version of your life that you cannot even imagine.”
8. Did you agree with this statement, “Refusing to consecrate everything to God does not diminish His love for you. It just diminishes your potential in life.” Why or why not?
