Backpack	1	<b>No rolling backpacks.</b>
Pocket Folder	2	No 3-prong folders please.
Clipboard	1	9" x 12" only, Sturdy quality (plastic ones break easily)
Non-flexible Ruler	1	Inches and Centimeters. (Not the kind with numbers written sideways)
White Glue	1	7-10 ounces Elmer's Brand works best
Glue Stick	2	Largest size
Eraser	2	Large size
Scissors	1	Short Blades (Fiskar Brand preferred)
Water Color Paints	1 set	At least 12 colors (not the kind with individual "pots" strung together)
Tissues	2 boxes	Large box
Paper Towels	1 roll	Large Roll
Pencil Box	1	Hard plastic, (no longer than 9 inches )
Disinfectant Wipes	1	Large container
Pencils	24	Sharpened. Put into gallon size zip lock baggy. We will ask for more, as needed.
Markers	1 set	Wide tip. Primary colors. Put into quart size zip lock baggy.
Colored Pencils	1 set	24 count (not neon colors) Put into gallon size zip lock baggy.
Crayons	1 box	8 count. These stay home. * see below "Homework Tool Box"*
Crayons	1 box	24 count maximum Put into quart size zip lock baggy.
Dry Erase Markers	1 box	Fine point, (Red, black, green, blue) Put into quart size zip lock baggy.
Coins	8 quarters, 20 dimes, 10 nickels, 30 pennies	Put into quart size zip lock baggy.
Earbuds/Headphones	1set	Any brand, They must be comfortable and fit well
1 inch 3-ring binder	1	Any color or style, to be used at home to put the take-home stories in

## Create a Homework Tool Box

Developing good study habits is key to becoming a successful student. Study habits we work on in First Grade are organization and planning. Having homework tools ready that are easily accessible will help your student be more successful in both study habits. We recommend designating a "Homework Place" away from distractions for your child to do homework. We also recommend you put together a Homework Tool Box to be kept in that place. Place the following items in the box: sharpened pencils, pencil sharpener, glue stick, scissors, eraser, 8 count crayon box\*, and colored pencils. A clipboard may also come in handy. Using a homework tool box will help ensure that your child will always have the tools he/she needs to complete homework assignments on time. Keep the Tool Box off limits for other uses. This will help your child understand the importance of being prepared to do his/her homework.
