SUNDAY REFRESHER

When John wrote to Gaius, he used language that was deeply personal. He called him "beloved" and celebrated the way he walked in truth and lived in love. For John, truth and love were never abstract; they were embodied in relationships, in hospitality, and in the way believers came alongside one another for the sake of Christ. This is what it looks like when truth and love move in tandem: they produce a community where lives are joined together for the gospel.

As the "new guy" at Expedition, Pastor Chadwick shared how he can already see this synergy at work. From pastors faithfully teaching, to volunteers stepping in to help one another, to a church that generously supports staff and missionaries, Expedition is living out what John commended in Gaius's house church. This is what it means to be fellow workers for the truth. Truth grounds us, love carries us, and together they create a synergy that makes the gospel visible in Payson and beyond.

- John calls us to be "fellow workers for the truth" (3 John 1:8). What role can you play in the synergy of Expedition, coming alongside others so truth and love move forward together?
