GET IN THE GAME: ACTIVATE CHURCH PARTICIPATION COLOSSIANS 3:20-25

Serving with Purpose

In Colossians 3:20-25, Paul teaches believers how to live out their faith in everyday relationships and responsibilities. Children are called to obey their parents in all things because such obedience reflects a heart aligned with Christ and is pleasing to God. In the same way, servants (or anyone in a working relationship) are encouraged to serve faithfully and sincerely — not merely when watched by others, but with wholehearted devotion, as if serving the Lord Himself. Paul reminds us that every duty and every task carries eternal significance because ultimately we are serving Christ, not just human authorities. He closes with a sobering reminder that God's justice is impartial: wrongdoing will be repaid fairly, without favoritism. This passage invites us to honor God in our homes, workplaces, and all relationships by living with integrity, respect, and devotion to Him.




