extravagant generosity 1 timothy 6:17-19 Ministry Flows From the Heart

1 Timothy 6:17-19 is part of the apostle Paul's first letter to Timothy, his young protégé serving as a pastor in Ephesus. Written during Paul's ministry in the early church, this passage provides crucial instructions about how Christians should view and use material wealth. Paul commands those who are rich not to be arrogant nor to put their hope in wealth, which is so uncertain, but to put their hope in God, who richly provides us with everything for our enjoyment.

Wealth is to be approached humbly, generously, and eschatologically. Rather than condemning wealth itself, Paul addresses the attitudes and behaviors that should characterize wealthy believers. Paul instructs Timothy to command the rich to be rich in good works, which implies that wealthy people are to be personally involved in things that are good and helpful.

1 Timothy 6 Riches and Godliness

Paul called upon slaves to count their own masters worthy of all honor – to be good, respectful workers for their masters. He did this not out of a general approval of the institution of slavery, but so that God would be glorified (so that the name of God and His doctrine may not be blasphemed).
