REDEMPTION OF SCROOGE ISAIAH 43:19-21

The Hope of Christmas Future

Isaiah 43:19–21 is part of the prophetic writings of Isaiah, likely addressing the Jewish people during or anticipating their Babylonian exile. Written by the prophet Isaiah as God's spokesperson, this passage contains one of Scripture's most famous declarations about God's transformative work. This is hope. Audacious. Unbridled. Expansive. Fulsome. Yet not fanciful or fabricated. But rooted in the realities of the past and present and leaning fully into the conviction of what God can and will yet do for God's people. God announces He is doing "a new thing" that is springing forth, making a way in the wilderness and rivers in the desert. God explains that He will make roads in the wilderness and rivers in the desert. The message is that the desert will become lush. Consequently, the animals will multiply and people will not thirst.

What Did God Mean When He Said 'Behold I Am Doing a New Thing'

Isaiah's prophesy pops up in the New Testament more than any other Old Testament writer. The way in the wilderness, Jesus our Messiah, came to earth as a babe born in humble circumstances. Jesus didn't arrive on the scene of Scripture the night He came down to earth. His earthly arrival was foretold for centuries across the Old Testament.
