

Stages of Faith Conjunctive

Day 1: Examining Our Souls

Reading: Psalm 139:23-24

As we begin this journey, let's reflect on the sermon's recurring question: "How are things with your soul?" This simple yet profound inquiry invites us into deep self-examination. Wherever you are in your journey, remember that growth often involves discomfort. Embrace the challenges that come with spiritual development, knowing they shape and refine your faith. Ask God to reveal the next step in your spiritual growth and for the courage to take it.

Day 4: Celebrating Diversity in Faith Expression

Reading: 1 Corinthians 12:4-7

The sermon emphasized the multidimensional aspect of faith, particularly in how we worship and serve. Today's reading reminds us that there are different kinds of gifts, service, and working, but the same Spirit. Reflect on the various ways you've experienced or expressed faith. Have you ever judged or felt judged for a particular style of worship or service? Ask God to broaden your perspective and appreciation for the diverse ways His people connect with Him. Consider trying a new form of worship or service this week, stepping out of your comfort zone to experience the richness of God's multifaceted church.

Day 5: Embracing God's Impossible Possibilities

Reading: Luke 1:37

The story of Abraham and Sarah reminds us that with God, the impossible becomes possible. Today's verse echoes this truth. Reflect on times in your life when God has done the seemingly impossible. Where do you need to trust God for the impossible now? Like Abraham and Sarah, we're called to a faith that looks beyond our limited human perspective to God's limitless power. Today, identify one area where you've given up hope or stopped believing for a miracle. Surrender it to God anew, asking Him to strengthen your faith and help you see from His perspective. Remember, our laughter of disbelief can turn into joyous laughter of fulfilled promises when we trust in God's timing and power.
