**FROM THE PASTOR**

**BEHOLD THE LAMB OF GOD**

Although we will be reading from the Gospel of Matthew throughout 2026, this Second Sunday of Ordinary Time always includes a reading from the Gospel of John. Why? I have no idea. I was not consulted on the matter.

Last week, our Gospel told the story of the Baptism of Jesus. The Gospel for today portrays a scene that took place the very next day, as John the Baptist was standing next to the River Jordan, and he saw Jesus walking toward him. He said to the disciples who were with him, “Behold the Lamb of God, who takes away the sin of the world.”

John says that when he baptized Jesus, he saw the Holy Spirit descend upon Him as a dove. He had been told that when he saw the Spirit descend upon someone, that would be the man who had been sent to proclaim. He announced Him as the Son of God.

**MARTIN LUTHER KING, JR. DAY**

On January 19, the United States honors Doctor Martin Luther King, Jr., and the Civil Rights Movement that he was so instrumental in guiding and leading up until his death on April 4, 1968.

We live in an age of anger and hostility, with issues of race, and war, and radically different visions for the future of America, much as we were in the late 1960's. We need Martin's teachings on nonviolence as much as we did in his lifetime. Certainly, there will be differences on many different issues, and many people are very passionate on some of those issues.

Martin Luther King, Jr. learned from the non-violence of Mahatma Gandhi, and his teaching on Satyagraha, or what was called Truth Force. He spoke of “militant non-violence” in which we stand up and fight for the truth and justice with the power of love. We Americans, in our own day, on whichever side we may be on, need to learn this.

**DAY OF PRAYER FOR THE PROTECTION  
OF UNBORN CHILDREN**

Thursday, January 22, is the Day of Prayer for the Protection of Unborn Children. Although *Roe v Wade* was overturned, we still use the date when abortion was first declared legal in all states throughout the United States. On June 24, 2022, the Supreme Court overturned *Roe v Wade* and put the issue of abortion back onto the states.

Kentucky has passed a law making abortion illegal, except in cases where the woman's life is in danger, or continuing the pregnancy could cause severe harm to the woman's health. So, we have made great progress in terms of elective abortions.

Please continue to support Pro-Life bills and policies for Kentucky. And pray for unborn children, and for women and men facing difficult or unplanned pregnancies.

**WEEK OF PRAYER FOR CHRISTIAN UNITY**

In 1054, most of the Eastern Churches split from the Catholic Church. And in 1517, Martin Luther published his famous 95 Theses, marking the beginning of the Protestant Reformation, in which churches began to split from the Catholic Church in Europe. This has left the Body of Christ shattered into three primary groups – Catholic, Protestant and Orthodox churches.

The Second Vatican Council called for us Catholics to begin working toward a healing of the Body of Christ, learning how to work with our Protestant and Orthodox brothers and sisters, and to seek eventual reconciliation.

Reunion with the Protestant churches is a more difficult process, as there are thousands of Protestant groups, and none has any authority over each other. The Eastern or Orthodox Churches are in union with one another, and they can negotiate as one. Also, we Catholics recognize legitimacy of the Eastern Churches, accepting their theology with a very few exceptions. Many people hope that a true reunion with the Churches of the East could be accomplished by 2054 AD, the 1,000th anniversary of the Great Schism.

Let us pray for this great reunion.

**SAINT AGNES, VIRGIN AND MARTYR**

Saint Agnes died in 304 AD, at the age of twelve or thirteen. She had refused to denounce her faith in Christ. Her sister was martyred with her. We keep in mind our neighboring parish of Saint Agnes.

The feast of St. Agnes is Wednesday, January 21.




