FROM THE PASTOR

EPIPHANY OF THE LORD

I hope that all of you had a great Christmas and New Year's. As much as we look forward to this season, it is also a stressful and difficult season for many of us. As much as we enjoy it, most of us are glad when the Christmas season is behind us. Well, we have one more week to go. Today, we celebrate The Feast of the Epiphany, and next Sunday, we celebrate The Baptism of the Lord.

If you or I have an epiphany, it refers to a sudden, profound realization of significant meaning. It is a mental breakthrough that transforms our vision of reality.

For The Magi, this was a significant breakthrough in terms of faith. The Star of Bethlehem appeared in the sky, revealing the birth of a new King. The Magi (magicians, astrologers) left their homes in Persia (modern-day Iran) to follow The Star to wherever it led them. They followed the light, which we all want to do.

When they came to Jerusalem, they went to King Herod, who consulted his advisors as to the birthplace of The Messiah. He then sent the Magi to Bethlehem, the birthplace of King David, about seven miles outside of Jerusalem. When they arrived, they came to the house where The Holy Family was staying and entered and worshipped the child.

The Magi were followers of Zoroastrianism, but now acknowledged Christ as their King and Lord. Thus, after the shepherds, these Gentile pagans were the earliest believers in Jesus as The Messiah.

Warned by an angel of the treachery of King Herod, they returned home by a different route than the one they had taken before.

When did you come to believe that Christ was your Lord and Messiah? Most of us grew up learning about Him and believing those who taught us. Later, we probably began questioning what we had learned, and perhaps even rejecting it. But if you are here today, you have made some personal decision to believe, and to follow Christ. How did that happen for you?

THE GOSPEL OF MATTHEW

Next Sunday, with The Baptism of the Lord, we begin the yearlong reflection of the Gospel of Matthew. We are in Year 1 of a three-year cycle of readings from the Synoptic Gospels - Matthew, Mark and Luke.

A few years ago, (I am guessing, three years ago) I did a series of talks on the Gospel of Matthew. If you go to our Mother of God website and then scroll down to "Father Mike's Talks," you will find nine talks on the different parts of the **Gospel of Matthew**.

You will also find a series of talks entitled **The Infancy Narratives, The Book of Revelation, an RCIA for Catholics, and Beginning to Pray**. A few others are not set up. Check them out. I think you will really benefit from them.

DEEPEN YOUR PRAYER

As we begin this new year, I want to focus on helping everyone grow in prayer. I will, from time to time, offer suggestions on how to pray that I hope will help you. We live in a time when on-line programs are very helpful.

Today, I want to begin looking at The Liturgy of the Hours. You can use a free app or you can buy a two-hundred-dollar set of books. I suggest the app. The four sets of books is going to be replaced around Easter, so do not invest at this time.

The Liturgy of the Hours – The Church's liturgy certainly includes the Mass and the celebrations of the other Sacraments. But there is a spiritual treasure house that most Catholics are barely aware of. This is called the Liturgy of the Hours.

There are five special "hours" that the Church prays every day. These are Morning Prayer, Midday Prayer, Evening Prayer, Night Prayer, and Office of Readings. These are made up of Psalms and Canticles (Psalm-like prayers not in the Book of Psalms), readings from Scripture, and other prayers. Priests are required to say the entire set of prayers every day.

There is an app that I use called **IBreviary**. You can get it for free in the App Store or Google Apps. Download and explore it. I will explain how to use it next week.

SAINT ELIZABETH ANN SETON

This Sunday, January 4, is The Feast of Saint Elizabeth Ann Seton, the first natural-born American to be canonized a saint. Originally from New York, Elizabeth and her family moved to Italy because her husband was ill, and it was determined that the climate in Italy would be better for his health. Unfortunately, he died. Elizabeth and her children were staying with a Catholic family in Italy, and through their example, she became drawn to the Catholic faith. She and her children joined the Catholic Church.

After some time, she returned to America and settled in Baltimore, Maryland. There, she became a teacher and gathered other young women around her to form the Sisters of Charity of Saint Joseph. (These are the same sisters who founded Mount Saint Joseph in Cincinnati.) Eventually, she would move with the other members of her order to Emmitsburg, Maryland. There, she founded Mount Saint Joseph School for Girls.

We honor Saint Elizabeth Ann Seton as a saint, and as an important figure in the development of the Catholic Schools throughout the United States. Because her feast falls on the Sunday of The Epiphany, its celebration is set aside for this year.






